## **Deadlines / Cost / Payments**

Space is limited and we may need to restrict attendance if we reach capacity. We recommend registering early.

#### Requirements

Candidates <u>must</u> attend the seminar if taking an laidō exam. Seminar instructors will detail elements of the art and technique that will be assessed during tests. Contact the event coordinator in the event of special circumstances, and we will try to accommodate.

Candidates must meet all requirements described in the "PNKF laidō Shinsa Rank Requirements" document, and agree and accept them.

Candidates must be current members of AUSKF or obtain written permission from their national Kendo Federation. If not AUSKF registered for the applicable membership year prior to the event, you are NOT ELIGIBLE to test. The applicant's AUSKF Membership Number must be included on the application form. *If you are a non- PNKF member*, see the special cases described below. The earlier these applications are received, the better.

  - a. **Essays**, if required, must be submitted on the "**laido Shinsa Written Exam Form**" and emailed to <a href="mailto:pnkfiaidoevent@gmail.com">pnkfiaidoevent@gmail.com</a>. Refer to the "<u>laido Shinsa Written Test Questions</u>" document for details.
  - b. Test and Certificate Fees must be paid in advance. You will be able to pay these fees with the seminar fees altogether online. If you cannot use the online payment system, please contact the Event Coordinator.

- c. If special considerations need to be made, such as for injury or medical limitations, please include a note of explanation so that this information may be given to the Examination Board. Doctor's notes are not required.
- d. AUSKF members outside PNKF: 1) Request for Kendo/laido Examination by an Affiliate Organization of the AUSKF signed by the member federation president, 2) a copy of menjyo (certificate), and 3) proof of the membership and registered name in the AUSKF database (screenshots of your "Individual Membership" and "Rank Info" taken from auskf.sport80.com (Athletes > [your name]).

FIK members outside AUSKF: 1) Approval letter written in English from the president of the FIK-affiliated organizations to permit taking a promotion examination, and 2) copy of menjyo (certificate).

#### Application Deadlines (Absolutely NO late entries!)

Online registration deadline AND applicable fees and shinsa paperwork deadline is <u>Saturday, September 6</u>. Submit early to make sure there are no problems with your application.

Cancellations and refunds: Requests for Shinsa cancellations, without exception, must be received no later than Saturday, September 13. Cancellations received after this date will have only the certificate fee returned. If an applicant does not attend the Shinsa for any reason including illness, the Shinsa fee is forfeited, and only the certificate fee is returned. Fees required by third parties in order to process refunds are the sole responsibility of the registrant. Please note that if an applicant does not pass the examination, only the certificate fee will be returned and the PayPal fee will be covered by PNKF. If special circumstances occur, please notify the Event Coordinator as soon as possible.

## **Basic Sword Safety Checklist**

#### Pacific Northwest Kendo Federation - PNKF Iaido Committee

21 October 2019 (revised 2/12/2022)

#### Introduction

Keeping your equipment clean and in good condition is a pleasure and a necessity. It is indicative of an advanced practitioner's respect towards his or her tools, and enhances everyone's safety and enjoyment of practice. In recent years, sword checks have become standard at all regional and national events, and are normal procedure for participants up to 5 Dan (6 Dan and higher rank instructors – though exempt from this requirement – are welcome to submit their swords for inspection voluntarily) at all PNKF sponsored and hosted laido events. *laidoka* are responsible for maintaining their equipment to ensure personal safety for themselves and others in their vicinity. When in doubt, consult your instructor or another qualified person, and be mindful that some sword repairs should only be undertaken by professionals.

## **Points of inspection**

There are several items that will be checked during sword inspection. These critical safety items are listed in order of importance, and any deficiencies should be addressed immediately.

#### **Essential Points for Inspection (used at PNKF Sword Checks)**

- 1. Is the sword Japanese-made as required by AUSKF and FIK rules?

  This rule was made to address issues with non-Japanese swords that proved more susceptible to breakage in past years, posing alarmingly dangerous conditions to others.
- 2. Is the blade in good condition, free of serious warpage, chips or dents?
- 3. Are the *mekugi* (retaining pin(s)) and *mekugi-ana* (retaining pin hole(s)) in good condition? The bamboo used for o-hashi or "chopsticks" is <u>not suitable</u> for mekugi. There are many varieties of bamboo that are soft and weak. Good mekugi are made of a special aged and smoked bamboo called *susudake* すず竹. Mekugi are carved from the outer part of the bamboo with the tightest grain. This is the hardest part of the bamboo. Other woods are not good substitutes for bamboo. Wood mekugi tend to snap, while bamboo tends to deform. Water buffalo mekugi are only suitable for *shirasaya* (holding scabbards), are purely decorative, and are <u>not</u> suitable for working swords. *PNKF inspections of shinken may request that you remove the mekugi for visual inspection of this essential component.*
- 4. Are the *tsuba* (guard) and *habaki* (collar) tight and free of noise or slippage when the sword is handled? Excessive movement puts extra stress upon the mekugi, posing an unnecessary risk to yourself and others.

#### Other Considerations: Primarily the Responsibility of the Practitioner

- 5. Is the koiguchi (mouth of the scabbard)-habaki (blade collar) fit tight enough to prevent falling out of the blade?
- 6. Is the saya (scabbard) in good repair and free of any cracks?
- 7. Is the *nakago* (tang) fit snugly within the tsuka (handle)
- 8. Is the tsuka-ito (handle wrap) in sufficiently good and tight condition to ensure safe practice?

Thank you for attending to your sword's safety. If you need assistance with basic repairs, PNKF laido Committee members may be able to help. When in doubt, please ask. We want everyone to enjoy laido practice safely.

The Spartan Center is a large, beautiful community facility operated by the City of Shoreline, Washington, in what used to be their high school. It features a full court gym with hardwood floor, various other use spaces, and ample free parking. The Center is close to several good restaurants and area shopping.

## **Accessibility**

Having a car will provide the easiest and fastest transportation to and from the facility, and parking at the Center is free. However, the Center is a short 0.4 mile walk on flat ground from the Shoreline North/185<sup>th</sup> Light Rail Station. Located on the east side of I-5, this station serves Shoreline Stadium, the Spartan Recreation Center, and surrounding neighborhoods. **Snohomish County Community Transit SWIFT Blue Line bus service** serves the station from points north, and **Sound Transit Light Rail** connects points north (Edmonds and Lynnwood) and south (Seattle and SeaTac Airport).

The annual PNKF Fall Iaido Taikai will be held Saturday September 27, beginning at 2:00pm. Competitor fee: \$20.00. Registration deadline: Saturday, September 6, 2025.

We would appreciate your help to set up before the competition!

#### Divisions by rank, 4 in all:

- Mudansha (no-rank to 1 Kyu)
- 1-2 Dan
- 3-4 Dan
- 5 Dan

The 3-4 Dan division will compete for the **Noguchi Cup**. In addition, the PNKF laido Committee has prepared special prizes for each division.

In honor of PNKF laido Taikai's first-ever 5 Dan division, competitors will have a chance to win a papered wakizashi shinken generously donated by PNKF laido Committee Co-Chair, Jonathan Bannister Sensei.

**Wakazashi** signed *Kaneki* (also *Kanemi*, probably *Kuriyama Kenjiro*, also known as *Suikosai*, a notable Showa Era (1926-1989) Gunto smith of the Seki tradition active 1926-1966, originally from Gifu Prefecture. Well-forged in decent polish, well-executed *notare* hamon, copper habaki, and "white paper" NBTHK certificate origami ranking the blade *Kicho*, literally "Precious". Nagasa 54.1cm, Sori 1.5cm, Motohaba 2.8cm, Motogasane 0.7cm, Sakihaba 1.9cm, Sakigasane 0.5cm, weight 467g.



#### Taikai format

- Mudansha to 2 Dan: 5 AJKF shitei-waza in 6 minutes
- 3 5 Dan: 1 koryu waza and 4 AJKF shitei-waza in 6 minutes

If you do not sit, you will do standing versions of AJKF seated waza. There will not be a separate set of kata for those who do not sit.

In order to participate in taikai, you MUST wear a Zekken with your name in English at the bottom and your dojo or Federation name at the top.

You must be a current member of AUSKF or FIK-affiliate in good standing to participate in the PNKF laido Taikai.
