Center based services are provided at the Ohio Center location. Creative Curriculum is used to guide teachers with age appropriate activities.

Serves to provide employment and training services to income-eligible individuals who are disengaged or dislocated from school or work. In addition to the academic and on the job training, participants have the opportunity to meet with a case manager on an individual basis throughout the program. The knowledgeable staff seek to support participants in acquiring new skills needed to succeed in work, school and life.

#### -Free Produce Distribution:

The Free Produce Distribution program helps to supplement folks that would otherwise be unable to afford fresh produce at the market. Mid-Ohio Foodbank makes deliveries to PICCA on the second and fourth Thursday of each month. Produce is then divided among the food

pantries throughout the county. These pantries in turn distribute the produce to their clients.

The goal of the Mobility Manager is to provide innovation and coordination of transportation options. Whether in the areas of Circleville, Pickaway County or regionally, we offer assistance to individuals, families, students and the elderly to find transportation solutions. This includes people with disabilities or those with low income. Through the Specialized Transportation program funding, PICCA's Mobility Manager is the one stop source for information and education about various transportation needs in the community. We assist in connecting with community and regional transportation services provided by both public agencies and private providers.

### -Representative Payee Program:

As a Representative Payee, PICCA is responsible for receiving the beneficiary's monthly check, keeping track of what is spent on the beneficiary's behalf and deciding how benefits can best be used for his or her personal care and well-being.

### -Toys For Tots:

Toys for Tots provides toys to income and age eligible children. Eligibility requirements for the program are total household income at or below 175% of poverty level and children ages 1-14. Applications are accepted beginning in September and toys are distributed until Christmas.

#### -Wheels to Work:

Provides qualifying low-income individuals an opportunity to save for the purchase of a vehicle through an IDA (Individual Development Account) enabling their employment and/or education attainment or retainment. The minimum savings requirement is \$1,000 with a maximum match amount of \$2,000.

# • Energy Outreach Services:

-Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP): Phone: 1-833-359-2804 The HEAP Winter Crisis Program provides income-eligible households with home-heating assistance. Eligible households must be threatened with disconnection of their heat, have been disconnected or have less than a 25 percent supply of bulk fuel or wood. The program typically runs from November 1 through March 31. The HEAP Summer Crisis Program provides assistance with paying an electric bill, help with the cost of central air conditioning repairs, and/or purchase of a window air conditioner or fan. Eligible households must include an elderly member (age 60 or older), or provide physician documentation that cooling

assistance is needed for a household member's health. The program typically runs from July 1 through August 31.

## -Percentage of Income Payment Plan (PIPP):

Percentage of Income Payment Plan, PIPP Plus, helps make monthly payments more affordable on a year-round basis. When PIPP Plus payments are made on-time and in-full, customers earn an incentive credit and a credit for past-due amounts. Each time you pay your required monthly payment on-time and in-full, you no longer owe the rest of that month's billed amount. You also receive a 1/24 credit toward any old debt. If you make full, on-time payments for 24 straight months, all of your past-due amounts will be eliminated. Households with a gross yearly household income at or below 150 percent of the federal poverty guidelines are eligible to participate in PIPP Plus.

## -Weatherization & Home Repair:

## -Central OH Area Agency on Aging (COAAA):

While PICCA has programs offered on an income basis, we also have a program offered to the elderly in Pickaway County through the Central Ohio Area Agency on Aging. Services offered include repair of heating systems, plumbing systems, hot water tanks, water taps and lines, hazardous electrical systems, severely deteriorated roofs, walls, floors and doors, ramps for handicapped-accessibility; kitchen and bathroom modifications for handicapped accessibility. Some restrictions apply for mobile homes.

**-The Electric Partnership Program (EPP):** Phone: 740-477-1655 The Electric Partnership Program (EPP) helps income-eligible Ohioans reduce their home electricity usage. As an EPP provider, Pickaway County Community Action Agency conducts in-home electricity audits and installs appropriate energy efficiency measures.

# -Home Weatherization Assist Program (HWAP):

The Home Weatherization Assistance Program (HWAP) offers income-qualified homeowners and renters the opportunity to lower residential utility costs by adding weatherization efficiencies. The program helps applicants better understand energy audits and provides informational resources to help people make cost-effective, realistic decisions regarding weatherization.

# -Ohio Housing Trust Fund (OHTF):

PICCA's Home Repair/Handicapped Accessibility Modification Program is funded by the Ohio Department of Development, Office of Housing and Community Partnerships. The program makes repairs necessary to keep a unit habitable by an individual or household to protect the integrity of the structure and assure the occupants' health and safety.

Examples of home repairs include repair or replacement of heating systems, plumbing systems, hot water heaters, hazardous electrical systems, severely deteriorated roofs, walls, windows and doors. Examples of handicapped accessibility activities include limited rehabilitation to remove barriers, such as installation of ramps or modification of kitchens or bathrooms.

## -OH Prog. for Affordable Energy (OPAE):

OPAE is a 501(c)(3) non-profit membership organization created to advocate for affordable energy policies for moderate and low-income Ohioans. OPAE conducts education and training programs for non-profit agencies. OPAE also manages energy efficiency assistance programs for low-income households, as well as provides consulting and research services to public and private organizations on a variety of energy-related topics. PICCA is able to come to your home and evaluate the energy consumption of your appliances. If they are greater than the guidelines provided by AEP or DP&L, we are able to replace them with a more energy efficient model. The appliances we are able to replace include: refrigerators/freezers, air conditioning units and light bulbs.

## -Housing Preservation Grant:

The USDA Housing Preservation Grant provides grants to sponsoring organizations for the repair or rehabilitation of housing owned or occupied by low and very low income rural citizens. USDA will award a total of \$10 million in Housing Preservation Grant Program funding for the repair and rehabilitation of rural housing units.

#### -Warm Choice:

Through the Warm Choice Program, low-income Columbia Gas of Ohio customers may receive a thorough house and heating equipment inspection, client education, heating equipment repairs or replacement, insulation and weather-stripping, and referrals to other energy programs. These services are provided free of charge to qualified customers.

# -Emergency Food & Shelter:

This program provides assistance to eligible clients for a one-month past-due rent amount, one month (or up to \$100) past-due utility payment or an emergency hotel stay. Funds are usually available beginning in March or April of each year for this one-time payment. The Emergency Food & Shelter Program was established in 1983, with legislation that created a National Board, chaired by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) consisting of representatives

from the American Red Cross, Catholic Charities USA, The Jewish Federations of North America, National Council of the Churches of Christ in the USA, The Salvation Army and United Way Worldwide.

## -Transitional Housing:

PICCA provides transitional housing for homeless Veterans. The transitional housing is for homeless single male Veterans, single female Veterans and Veterans with families. This program is a partnership with the Chillicothe V.A. Medical Center. All residents receive case management with action plan goals to aid in transitioning to permanent housing.
