- [evrardjp] Discussion about generic reboots vs customizable reboots:
 - Do we want to reduce attack surface by using syscall reboots
 - Pros: Independent of the base OS
 - Cons: We are reimplementing systemd/OS reboots, with all the race conditions and data corruptions (sync errors)
 - Do we want to introduce customizable command for reboot:
 - Pros: Allows users to run on different OSes, not only ubuntu/SUSE :)
 - Cons: Does not reduce privileged pods attack surface
 - Do we want to establish a “mixed” model:
 - Have a flag with --reboot-method=syscall/command ?
 - Have a flag like --host-reboot-command (and we figure out how to find the host namespace)?
 - ACTION: Daniel to find somebody to review #178.
 - This would be a good stepping stone.
 - ACTION: Daniel to file a meta-issue to track this work and collect input on the approaches listed above.
- [evrardjp] Should we provide different branches of kured to update the guest alpine OS?
 - Pros: We have a simple story for providing hotfixes to certain branches/old kubernetes versions
 - Pros: We can have updated alpine images, which are more secure
 - Cons: This means we'll have to maintain a ton of images, and the versions can be quite complicated.
 - Cons: It sends a message that we are ensuring the long term security of possibly old kured containers, which for the moment is not the case.
 - Conclusion (for now): need to understand how many k8s versions are currently supported. Also need basic release automation and basic smoke testing. Maybe something to be worked on during Hacktober, etc?
 - Possible discussion: should kured be more closely aligned with k8s and its releases.

 - ACTION: Daniel to review #183, #184, #185 - also get somebody from WW to review.
- [evrardjp] change to kubectl go module to drain (#124)
 - JP has worked on a proof of concept, might be able to mentor somebody to complete it.
