In this assignment, you are going to try to make theory into practice.

Read: Burkhart, A. (2006). Object Lessons: Thinking about material culture, *Art Education*,

59(2), pp. 33-39.

Part 1 (Due 10/14, Wed., 9 am):

1. Find ONE type of object or category of objects that can represent the material culture of the middle school students. What research have you done in order to know (e.g. books, Internet, interview middle schoolers, etc.)?
2. Anne Burkhart lists some suggestions for studying material culture in the art classroom. Please **choose** one suggested aspect to investigate and connect with your exploration in **Step 1**.
3. How will you guide the middle school students to use the selected type of object or category of objects as a medium to create an artwork?
 - a. Which aspect that Burkhart suggests did you choose to connect with the selected type of object or category of objects in this project?
 - b. How will you probe students' interests to do the project?
 - c. What skills or art methods can students explore through making the project?
 - d. Which contemporary artist(s) can you find to best support you to discuss the

project with the students?

4. Write a statement to demonstrate your findings and answers for Step 1 to 3.

Part 2 (Due 11/2, Mon., 9 am):

1. Write a lesson plan based on your investigation in **Part 1 using our lesson plan template**. You have to label clearly who will be your target student group (grade level). The lesson is for 1 hour completion time.
2. Create a Teaching video:
 - 1) You have to record a teaching video **for your project idea, instruction, and the art making process** for about 15-20 minutes. The video must be exported no less than 720 p viewing quality and with a clear focus on the presenting objects (and/or the teacher).
 - 2) Teacher example: Complete a teacher example to show your students how you create an artwork based on the project idea. **The teacher example must be included in your video.**
3. The lesson plan and the video submission will be reviewed by Mrs. Riep and Claire. You will earn **a plus “+”** to your final course grade of the section of Art Projects if your lesson and video are selected for Mrs. Riep’s class. *(For example, if your grade is Proficient, it will become Proficient to Advanced. If your grade is Proficient to Advanced, it will become Advanced)*

Part 3 (Reflection, Due 11/2, Mon., 9 am):

You make a written reflection for this entire project

- a. What do you learn from the process of designing this project and making the artwork (teacher example)?
- b. Which part of the project can make your students excited?
- c. Which part of the project may challenge your students?
- d. What are the differences between preparing your middle school lesson compared to preparing the elementary/artistic abilities lesson?
- e. Post your entire project: lesson idea, lesson plan, instruction video, your artwork (teacher example), and the reflection on your e-portfolio under the category of “Art Projects” and submit the page link to canvas
