globalization - interactions - benefits - unfairly - costs

One of the effects of *globalization* is that it promotes and increases *interactions* between different regions and populations around the globe. However, for different reasons, not everyone *benefits* the same from globalization and technological change: wealth is *unfairly* distributed and economic growth came at huge environmental *costs*. The largest cities in the world include: *Tōkyō*, Japan; *New Delhi*, India.; *Shanghai*, China.; *México City*, Mexico; and *São Paulo*, Brazil. Each of these cities classifies as a *megacity*, a city with more than 10 million people living there. The UN estimates the world will have 43 megacities by 2030.
