The State of Dixie and the Department of Justice are concerned with recent actions taken from the White House to curb the enforcement of our immigration laws. Keeping criminals out of our communities is a top priority for the Department and State and will continue to play a central role in our law enforcement efforts regardless of unilateral actions taken by the White House.

There are an estimated eight to ten million illegal aliens in our nation at this moment, although this Department believes that to be a conservative estimate. Immigration and Customs Enforcement has approximately 2,000 agents. Without state and local cooperation, the efforts by our partners in federal law enforcement agencies to enforce our laws are nearly impossible. It causes great concern to the Department that a non-law enforcement career politician is dictating policy without consulting experts — something the White House clearly currently lacks.

While the pro-criminal administration in Washington has broken the partnership between our State and the Federal Government abruptly, all State and local law enforcement agencies in Dixie are directed to continue cooperating with our partners in the FBI, DHS, and ICE. State and local law enforcement within the State of Dixie are directed to transfer illegal aliens in custody over to our Federal law enforcement partners at the appropriate agency or bureau. We will never cease this fight.

Even if it is lost on the current administration, the State of Dixie recognizes the importance of local cooperation while enforcing our laws. Dixie stands with our people against criminal aliens and the danger they pose to our communities.
