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Planning a Loop Schedule

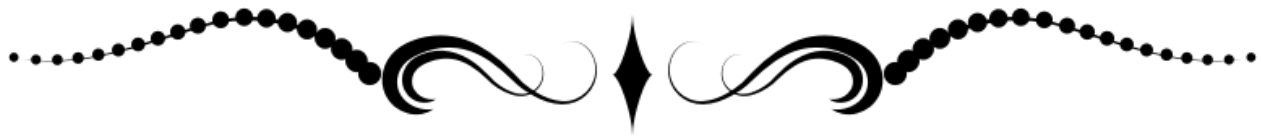
Step 1. List all the subjects you'd like to have on a loop schedule.

Step 2. Beside each subject write the # for how frequently you'd like to have that subject in comparison to the others. For example; you might want to have history 3x for every 1x you have art.

Step 3. Use your frequency column to fill in the list below. For example; if you use the twelve lined list below and you have history 3x you could (just a suggestion) start off with history, by writing history on lines 1, 5, & 9. Then move on to your next subject with the next highest frequency number. Once you finish with those then the subjects that only have a frequency of 1 you just fill in wherever you want in the remaining lines.

Tips:

- Don't loop subjects that should be or must be done everyday such as; Bible & math.
- You don't want to have the loop schedule too long. Keep it as short as possible and once you complete a 'circle' of it it'll give you and the children a feeling of accomplishment.
- You could split the loop schedule into two loop schedules. One for some of the lesser core subjects like; history, science, geography, & health. The other loop schedule for elective (non-core) subjects such as; art, music, poetry, literature study, physical education, life skills (home ec), etc...
