
Tips:

- Don't loop subjects that should be or must be done everyday such as; Bible & math.
- You don't want to have the loop schedule too long. Keep it as short as possible and once you complete a 'circle' of it it'll give you and the children a feeling of accomplishment.
- You could split the loop schedule into two loop schedules. One for some of the lesser core subjects like; history, science, geography, & health. 
