The Maine Startup Challenge (MSC) is a statewide entrepreneurship competition hosted by Maine Venture Fund. Students identify a real-world problem and capture an idea in a simple, one-page business plan format. See the [Applicant Guide](#) for full details.

Educators can use MSC as a short lesson, a project-based activity, or an enrichment experience, with flexibility to adapt it to their time, students, and setting.

A Simple Classroom Flow (One Option)

1. Introduce entrepreneurship and problem-solving
2. Brainstorm problems students see in their community
3. Walk through the one-page Business Plan Canvas
