

Southern New Hampshire University

The Southern New Hampshire University is a non-profit private institution located in Manchester, New Hampshire.

Founded as the Accounting and Secretarial Science School in 1932, the institution presently ranks as one of the fastest-growing universities in the U.S. It provides sanctuary to more than [135,000 online and 3,000](#) on-campus students enrolled in over 200-degree programs.

Affording Southern New Hampshire University

Southern New Hampshire University puts higher education within reach, making it financially possible for admitted students to afford their degrees, regardless of their economic background and citizenship.

The university offers merit and need-based financial aid to enable students to advance their studies without incurring lifelong debts. For example, [nearly all of its student body](#) receive some form of aid each. And they could get up to \$20,000 in grants and scholarships.

Also, Southern New Hampshire University aims to keep its tuition and related costs low for all students to enable them pursue their degrees and goals.

Additionally, the fees are relatively stable. The school's total cost of attendance has not increased for a long time, perhaps to give students some predictability in affording their education.

However, the cost of attending the university varies by program type.

Besides the university's funding options, students can also explore schools and programs-specific opportunities to supplement their earnings. The university also encourages them to seek external support for their education.

Let's start with the university's graduate financial support.

University-Specific Graduate Funding Options

SNHU supports students with grants, scholarships, federal work-study, and loans. However, graduate students receive assistance primarily as Direct and Graduate loans. They could also explore work-study options for obligation-free funding.

The university determines financial aid eligibility through the [Free Application for Federal Student Aid \(FAFSA\)](#). So, you must complete the form to stand a chance of receiving financial support.

Now, let's examine some of the ways the university helps fund students' education.

Scholarships and Grants

Scholarships and grants are obligation-free; so you don't have to repay them. The school offers them to students demonstrating financial need.

However, students get the aid by program type.

For instance, online undergrad students receive grants and endowment scholarships, while their on-campus counterparts get grants, Resident and Endowment Scholarships.

Students' FAFSA applications determine how much they'll receive.

Federal Work-Study

The Federal Work-Study program enables students to earn money while studying to support their educational expenses. The university allows them to perform work in the community and at the institution related to their course of study.

Loans

Students can explore any of these educational loan options to fund their education.

Direct Loan Information

Direct loans are loans based on the borrower's needs. They are the most common type of loan for funding education. Graduate students who want to take loans are eligible for Direct loans.

Parent PLUS Loan Information

Only undergrads can access this loan option. The federal loan allows undergraduate students' parents to borrow to fund their children's education.

Graduate PLUS Loan Information

Graduate and professional degree students are eligible for the PLUS Loan Program. It does not cover other financial expenses. Students can only access the support up to their cost of attendance.

How SNHU Determines Financial Aid

Students can apply for financial aid as long as they meet the eligibility criteria. The school encourages those with needs to apply for assistance.

However, they must file some documents to get considered for financial assistance. And let's look at them.

FAFSA

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid lets you apply for federal and state financial aid. The university and Education Department determines your eligibility and financial needs based on your responses.

To be FAFSA-eligible, you must:

- Enroll as a degree-seeking student in the university
- Be a U.S. citizen or an eligible noncitizen
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress (SAP)
- Not owe a federal educational loan
- Not default on a refund on a federal educational grant or loan
- Possess a certificate showing that you have a high school diploma or its equivalent.

Use the school code (002580) to file your FAFSA application.

Student Aid Report

Eligibility for financial aid in SNHU relates to your Expected Family Contribution. The information you gave in your FAFSA will determine how much assistance you will receive.

The school encourages students to check their Student Aid Report for errors after receiving it.

SNHU Graduate Funding Opportunities by Schools

Now let's look at some of the school-specific funding options.

Sadly, only a few schools provide scholarships and grants. Most of them offer loans as financial aid. You can explore what's available for you to advance your studies.

SNHU School of Business

The Southern New Hampshire School of Business offers both merit and need-based aid.

However, you can't apply for them. The School considers students at admission based on their application materials. It awards the need-based support to students demonstrating financial need.

Sadly, international students are not eligible for its scholarships. But they may explore work-study opportunities to fund their education.

Now, let's examine some of these scholarships.

Finlay Family Scholarship

Eligibility: Students enrolled in the online SNHU MBA school.

Robert J. Finlay, an alumnus of Southern New Hampshire University, founded the Finlay Family Scholarship. It's a need-based scholarship.

The aid aims to assist enrolled SNHU MBA students who live in New Hampshire to fund their MBA degrees. On-campus students who show a willingness for entrepreneurship have a better shot at the scholarship.

Hassa Jadvani Memorial Scholarship

To be eligible for the Hassa Jadvani Memorial Scholarship, you must enroll in the SNHU Finance curriculum.

You must enroll in the SNHU Finance curriculum to be eligible for this scholarship. The merit and need-based support funds online MBA students in any of the Graduate School of Business programs.

The scholarship prioritizes Sikh or Hindu students of Indian descent.

However, if no students show enough need for this scholarship, the School considers other students enrolled in its MBA program.

Matthew Stuart Van Kleek

Qualification is strictly for online and off-campus students enrolled in the Graduate School of Business.

School of Business Scholarship Fund

The SNHU Alumni Association and the School of Business collaborated to finance scholarships that help fund MBA students' education.

By partnering with organizations like the SNHU Alumni Association and the School of Business, SNHU MBA graduates receive scholarships on a need and merit basis.

Prospective eligible students must show a need for the scholarship or possess a solid academic prowess.

Dr. Jacqueline Mara Scholarship

Eligibility: Off-Campus MBA students with U.S citizenships

The Dr. Jacqueline Mara Scholarship is both a need-based and merit-based scholarship. Dr. Jacqueline Mara, a former Dean and Trustee Emeritus founded the scholarship.

Off-Campus MBA students who are U.S citizens, fund their education.

Students enrolled in the traditional business disciplines will be given priority for the scholarships.

Ronald L. Woodward Memorial Scholarship

Founded in memory of a former New York native student by the SNHU alumni, The Ronald L. Woodward Memorial Scholarship gives students who live in Upstate N.Y.first priority.

Students studying accounting, accounting/information systems, information technology and, business administration will receive a particular preference for this scholarship.

The school awards the scholarship on a need basis.

School of Education SNHU

Admission Difficulty: **Hard**

Location of the Program: **Offline.**

Each year, the South New Hampshire University offers a limited number of institutional scholarships to students on a need basis.

The scholarship is only available to students enrolled in SNHU's Graduate School of Education.

Stephen F. Knapp Scholarship

The scholarship is need-based, offering it to accepted students who applied for financial aid and have demonstrated need.

Eligibility for the awards demands that enrolled Education students who are willing to major in Special Education get the scholarship.

More Internal Scholarships

Students in graduate programs and schools may apply for the Resident Assistant and Assistant Resident Director Scholarship Programs.

The Office of Residence Life receives scholarship applications for these scholarships.

Resident Assistant Scholarship Program

Students elected for positions like resident assistants in their dorms, apartments, and townhouses get work scholarships efficiently handling those positions.

To be eligible for the award, the graduate student must either be upper-class or have a CGPA of at least 2.5.

Assistant Resident Director Scholarship Program

Students elected for two dorms and townhouses will get the Assistant Residence Director Scholarship Program work scholarships.

Only students enrolled in the on-campus graduate program are eligible for the awards.

Veterans Aid at SNHU

Admission Difficulty: **Easy**

Location of Program: **Offline and Online**

Members of the U.S. military services may be eligible for military discounts of up to 30% at SNHU.

The military MBA Scholarship considers all of its members for financial aid. Eligibility includes students who are veterans and those in active service members and their spouses.

Here's how the VA department could help fund your SNHU education.

Veterans Scholarship

The school's alumni of veterans of the Vietnam war established this scholarship.

The chief aim of the scholarship is to assist current veteran students, the dependents of veterans financially or actively serving in the military in getting a graduate degree.

Only the brightest students and those who show real financial need will qualify for the awards.

Edward Nassar Veterans Memorial Scholarship

The SNHU Alumni Association created the scholarship fund in memory of Edward Nassar, a former student at Southern New Hampshire University.

The fund aims at supporting Southern New Hampshire University students on a need and merit basis.

However, the association will consider military veterans and their dependents more for the awards.

Interested applicants must submit a letter of consideration and must have a GPA of 2.8 or higher.

International Students

At SNHU, international students get the opportunity to have an experiential learning experience.

Like the domestic student, if you are an international student, you can apply for some scholarships.

Let's look at them.

Graduate Scholarships For New Southern New Hampshire University Students

Admission Difficulty: **Hard**

Location of the Program: **Offline.**

The graduate scholarships for incoming SNHU students are limited in nature. Only students with exceptional academic excellence will get the award.

Let's get to it.

International Merit Scholarship

Provide brief intro

Eligibility: Applicant must gain admission into SNHU. The applicant's minimum undergraduate Grade Point Average must be 3.0.

Amount: \$4,000, a one-time non-refundable tuition award over two terms.

Best Time to Apply: Upon Admission

This merit-based scholarship is available for incoming international master's students only. Your academic strength will qualify you for the aid.

All applicants must first complete the [SNHU application](#) to process their admission. Students will receive awards after acceptance to SNHU.

How to Apply

- Students must complete the scholarship application by clicking the blue Scholarship button in the applications menu bar. Students will also receive a confirmation email after every completing the application. The school encourages students to save the confirmation email for record purposes.
- Submission of the completed scholarship application must be at least 30 days before the start of the term.

Scholarships Available for Currently Enrolled Students

Enrolled students are eligible for some merit and need-based scholarships.

Let's go.

Charles and Barbara Bickford International Scholarship

International students studying on the SNHU Manchester campus are eligible for the scholarship.

Applicants receive priority considerations: students from Vietnam or Cambodia, students from Southeast Asia or China, and lastly, from other foreign countries.

Biesek/Smith Scholarship

The Biesek/Smith Scholarship was founded by John and Catherine-Ann (Smith) Day in memory of Catherine-Ann's mother, Mildred K Smith, and Helder Biesek. The former SNHU

student at the Institute for Language Education (ILE) died in a tragic accident before completing her education.

The scholarship aims at providing aid awards to international students enrolled in the University's English as a Second Language program.

The Biesek/Smith Scholarship is a merit and need-based one.

Hassa Jadvani Memorial Scholarship

To be eligible for the Hassa Jadvani Memorial Scholarship, you must enroll in the SNHU Finance curriculum.

And the scholarship is both merit and need-based.

However, if you're a Sikh or Hindu student of Indian descent, you're in luck because your chances of getting the scholarship are high.

If no students show enough need for this scholarship, other students enrolled in SNHU's MBA will get the awards instead.

Li Xu Scholarship Fund

The Li Xu Scholarship Fund is in memory of an SNHU student Li Xu. This scholarship aims at showing the generous giving and sharing spirit of Li Xu. It shows this commitment by funding the needs of new students.

Eligible applicants must show interest in helping new students understand the academic culture of the University and the social culture of New Hampshire. This scholarship is open to both International and U.S. students.

Best Time to Apply: Applications are available from mid-January through mid-March.

Applications for the Biesek/Smith scholarship for ILE students are available in the ILE office from mid-March through mid-May.

More Funding Options for International Students

Apart from scholarships, there are more funding options for International graduate students at SNHU.

They include student employment, resident assistantships, athletic scholarships, and student loan programs.

Student Employment

Most On-Campus works offer students a maximum of 20 hours of work per week. Even though the jobs are available, students may not work for 20 hours per week because of their school schedules.

New students may find it tough to land a job because of their limited previous work experience and experience adjusting as new students on the campus. Earnings from student work in the U.S is, therefore, a supplement and never crucial to meeting the expenses of studying.

Resident Assistant

Job openings for Residence Assistants come from time to time.

A Resident Assistant position will require that you live in a campus residence hall and be in charge of helping students on a floor.

The awards for being a Resident Assistant include a scholarship, a stipend, and a reduced rate on single room accommodation.

First-year students are not eligible for this funding option.

Athletic Scholarships

Students with prowess in athletics in basketball, cross-country, lacrosse, soccer (football), tennis, baseball, softball, and volleyball get athletic scholarships.

The coaches determine how much the scholarships are worth. Often, the scholarship amounts may vary.

International Student Loan Program (Private Loans)

Eligibility: International students who have relatives or friends living permanently in the U.S., willing to co-sign or guarantee the loan.

Only eligible students may qualify for the International Student Loan Program.

The International Student Loan Program offers you loans that may cover your entire cost of education. And the loan repayment terms range up to 25 years.

OPT - Optional Practical Training and Academic Training

F-1 international students can extend their student status to work in the US for up to 12 months after graduation in OPT.

In some cases, the extension could run for three years, depending on the student's course.

However, J-1 international students may extend their student status to work in the US for up to 18 months. Other times, they may work for the period of the entire course of study in the US.

Finally, students can work full-time, full-paying positions related to their course of study in companies anywhere in the US.
