### VI. Student Achievement Data

- a. Winter Student Achievement Data (Early January) / Information
  - 77% of K-5th graders scored proficient on the Winter Star Math exam.
  - 71% of 2-5th graders scored proficient on the Winter Star Reading exam.
  - 71% of K-1st graders scored proficient on the Winter Star Early-Literacy exam.

The SSC reviewed both reports above. Mr. Hertz discussed that the proficiency is compared to all students in students in the U. S. Parents will be getting a copy of the student report to see their child's progress. Math, Reading, and Star Early reading scores have slightly increased from each testing period.

**a. EL Math Data / Information**

- . May 2022 CAASPP: ELs 23.5% vs. All 56.25% (50% gap)
- . Jan 23 Dreambox (3.7 vs. 4.9 lessons per week) 7/23 ELs are on pace weekly (30.4%) February Goal: 50%.

We are not on pace for making our 50% EL goal. Our goal is to increase Dreambox lessons for this population. Mr. Hertz will review these results EL STAR math results and share with the group.

We have accomplished many of our goals for this year. We have fixed gate 12 so that it automatically closes , have ordered the correct knox boxes and have ordered the three additional cameras needs for the blind spots.

In addition, the district will be replacing our bollards with locking bollards. Mr. Hertz asked the district to replace the fence at MES so that it is similar to Webster's fence. The tentative date for the fence replacement is July 2023.

Lastly, the safety training was completed for the staff last week. Training included CPR, AED and stop the bleed training.

We will need to adopt a plan for 23-24 by October of next year. We will start planning for this in April. The school will send out survey to the community to ask for their input on the needs of the school. Mr. Hertz will provide the survey results from last year to the SSC .
