Summary

General Information

LearningExpress Library Complete was designed for those looking to improve core academic skills, pass the GED, prepare for college, and/or to become a U.S. citizen. LearningExpress contains several learning centers that students get access to, including:

- **High School Equivalency:** Test preparation for the GED Test® in English and Spanish, and the HiSET® exam.
- **Prepare for College:** Test preparation for AP classes, PSAT/SAT, ACT, TOEFL iBT, and IELTS exams.
- **Grades 4-8 Educator Resources:** Skill-building resources for elementary school math and English language arts skills, and middle school math, ELA, and social studies skills.
- **High School Students:** Skill building resources for math, English language arts, science, social studies, technology, and logic and reasoning.
- **Adult Core Skills:** Skill building resources for math, reading, writing, speaking, and grammar, and U.S. Citizenship test prep.

Technology Requirements

Users with a computer, tablet, or smartphone can access LearningExpress using either the Android or iOS apps or via web browser (all webpages have a responsive design, making them accessible for users on smartphones).

Mobile Accessibility

Learning Express Library apps are available for iOS and Android devices.

Logistics

Administrators can group students into classes with IDs. Students can be assigned to a class, but they have access to all courses on the platform. However, through LMS integration, an instructor could assign specific lessons to students and track student progress through those lessons. If a student leaves and rejoins a program, they can start where they left off. Agencies can retrieve historical data on students as far back as 36 months.

Reports

There are reports available to look at student progress, resources utilized, and time spent on the site. Time on task reports are available and customizable by date. Typically, only administrators have access to these reports, but they can set up teachers as administrators.

Instruction

The course content aligns with CCRS. Students are given a pre-test and a corresponding study plan. Material is presented to students in units and within those are lessons. Students can read through each lesson or skip around at their discretion. Each unit ends with a summary and then a quiz. The modules end with a post-test. Students are able to progress through the coursework without getting passing scores on formative and summative assessments.

Student Interface

Students can work through lessons/activities independently, see which lessons have been completed, and tell if the content has been mastered. Navigating the site is not difficult but will likely require some training for most students. Basic tech support is available (password retrieval, ability to report errors, etc.). The interface is appropriate for a diverse adult population. Lessons from the GED and Adult Core Skills modules have to be read by the students (no video content or screen readers). The Adult Core Skills content covers basic skills. These lessons require high school level reading skills.

Teacher Interface

Teachers can monitor students' work and can identify areas where they need assistance. However, teachers cannot assign lessons. Instead, a user is given a personal "My Center" upon account creation. Any of the online resources used are automatically saved to this online portfolio.
