Ministry Scenarios

14. Mina and her family are refugees from Afghanistan. Mina has been a regular student at Friendship House's English Club and she enjoyed it so much, she referred several of her Afghan friends to the class. Mina and her family received assistance with food and furniture from Friendship House. Friendship House also helped her secure a job in the local school system. After hearing about the Talitha Koum Program (TKP), she asked if her 3 children could attend. Friendship House staff explained TKP to her and its biblical focus and she still agreed to let them attend even though they were practicing Muslims. After several days of attendance, she asked if her children could sit out during the Bible lesson, as they were coming home and wanting to talk about the Bible lessons they were learning. How would you respond?

15. Annie's family has been in the neighborhood of Friendship House for many years. Her parents have been regular participants in the Food Pantry Program. Friendship House staff has suspected the family of drug use in the past and the family is known to have a criminal history. After years of prodding, the family finally agreed to let Annie attend the Talitha Koum After-School Program. Annie is a bright girl who is generally well-behaved. One day after walking Annie home from the program, you smell the distinct odor of marijuana coming from her apartment and you can hear her parents yelling and cursing at each other. From your experience with the family, you know that if the parents get upset with you they'll likely pull Annie out of the program. What would you do?

16. Two boys in the program—Kyle and Chris—come from very different backgrounds. They come from different racial backgrounds, different cultures and different socioeconomic upbringings. What they have in common is that they both come from families that are not following the Lord. Kyle and Chris play together a lot, but they also seem to get into arguments and fights almost every day. How would you respond?
