



Attention MUSD Families and Team Members,

We continue to be on alert for any developments regarding the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) through the Santa Clara County Public Health Department and the Santa Clara County Office of Education.

Here is a review summary to date from County Public Health:

- **Santa Clara County total cases: 2**
 - 1 case fully recovered as of February 20, 2020
 - 1 case in isolation
- **Currently, there is NO evidence novel coronavirus is circulating in Santa Clara County and the immediate risk to the public remains LOW. However, the County is preparing for the possibility of widespread transmission of the novel coronavirus in the United States**

As of February 20, 2020, the first confirmed case of novel coronavirus in Santa Clara County has fully recovered and has been released from isolation. He was never sick enough to be hospitalized. He was isolated at home and was monitored by public health staff for the duration of his isolation. The second case remains in isolation.
