

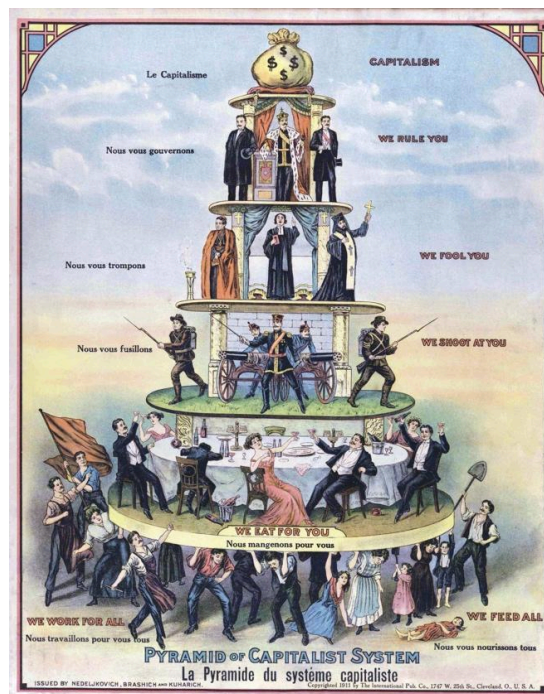
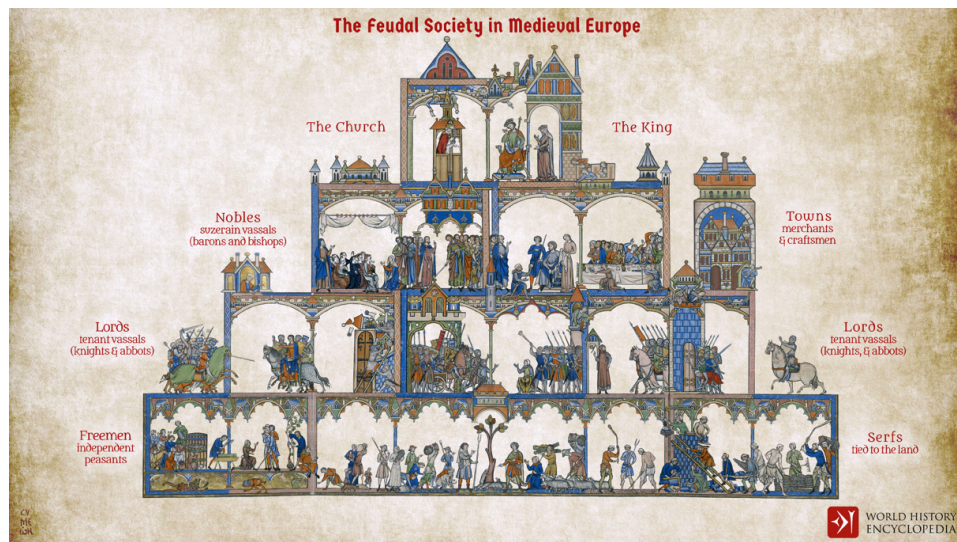
PYRAMIDS OF CAPITALISM

- Do you think the capitalist system was a revolutionary transformation from the feudal system, or did the structure of the social pyramid remain basically the same?

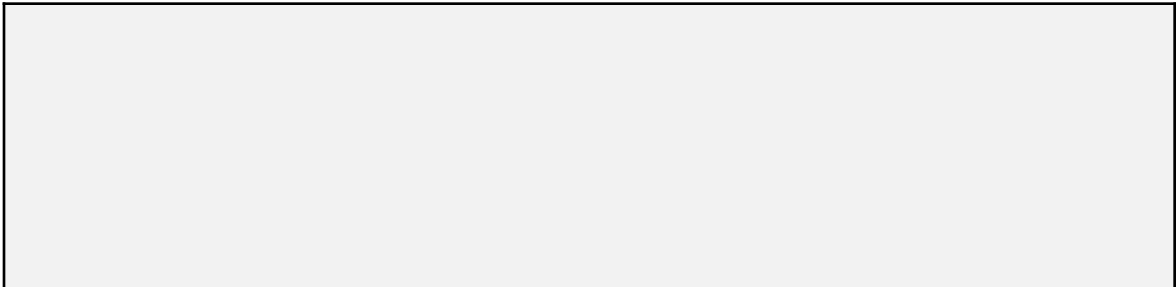
