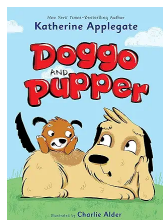
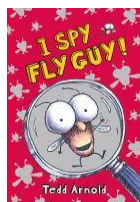
***Don't Throw It to Mom (series)*****Adler, David A.****32 pages**

Mo Jackson is a little boy with a big passion for sports. He may not be the biggest, the strongest, or the fastest player, but he won't let that stop him from playing!

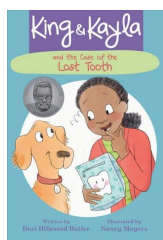

***Doggo and Pupper (series)*****Applegate, Katherine****32 pages**

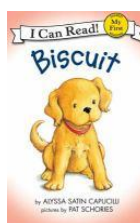

***King and Kayla and the Case of the Lost Tooth (series)*****Butler, Dori Hillestad****32 pages**

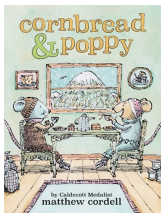

A talking tiger approaches a family during their annual end-of-summer camping trip and is befriended by the youngest, a boy who does not feel ready for first grade.

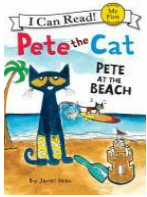


Cornbread & Poppy

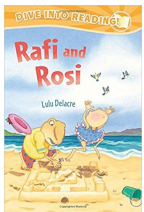


Pete the Cat (series)

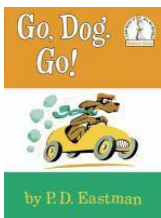


Rafi and Rosi / Rafi y Rosi (series)

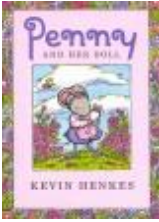


Princess Truly

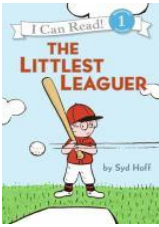


Penny and her Doll

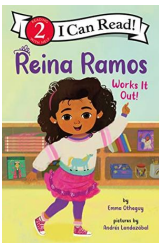


The Adventures of Otto (series)

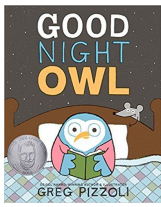


Raina Ramos

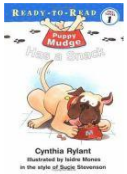


Goodnight Owl (series)

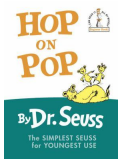


Puppy Mudge (series)

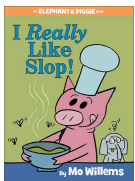


Fox the Tiger (series)

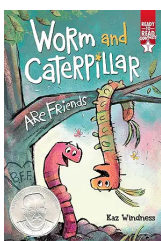


Elephant & Piggie (and others by Mo Willems)
