July 28th 1851

Dear Gov

I write you without knowing whether you are at this time among the Sioux, at St Paul or on your way to Pembina.

I have but little cheering news to write you in regard to the removal as I have only herd from Mr Boulieau and he is meeting with many difficulties. I still think that he will surmount them and will suceed in geting a large portion there out

I have received nothing from the Chippewa River country since I arrived here. I am in hopes to get some news from this quarter within a short time and as soon as received will communicate it to you.

By information received from George Warren I am informed that Mr Rice has told the Indians not to remove and he will send a large outfit into the country this coming winter.

My first quartily returns of the removal I have forwarded to you by the way of the Lakes. I presume they will reach you before this comes to hand

There are assembled at this place about five hunard Indians and there will be by the last of next week I think 1500. Those that are here are making a desparate effort to have their monied annuity paid them at Fond Du Lac. I have refused to make it at this pointe, but have been advised to do so, by Mr Boutwell, if I became convinced that it will endanger the removal by my not granting their request, I shall do so but I must say that I cannot see the necessity of doing so when they are obliged to come to Sandy Lake after their goods annuity

I hope the Department will act upon my recommendation for a company of Infantry being stationed at this place. I am much annoyed by whiskey and although the law prohibits this traffic, the sivil authorities are unable to enforce them, besides if a company were now here it would facilitate the removal very much

Pleas let me hear from you as often as convenient and believe me with high regard your friend
