What this project is about?

Lives Without Implicit Bias

In this Technology Theme Park project, my focus is on lives without Implicit bias. I will create a website that focuses on implicit bias and offer five activities and videos to teach this theme. Implicit bias refers to the beliefs and attitudes that affect our understanding, actions and decisions in an unconscious way. It can help us decide who is friend or foe, or determine whether a situation is dangerous or just coincidental. Unlike explicit bias, where individuals are fully aware of their prejudices and attitudes about others, implicit bias stems from subtle cognitive processes that are developed through experiences- whether actual or perceived.

The five technology-rich activities to support the topic Lives Without Implicit Bias so users can the issue of Bias and practice solutions are based on test –Project Implicit where users will be asked to select five Implicit Association Test (IAT) from a list of possible topics. Users will also have the option to report their attitudes. Users need to press Ctrl+click on their device to follow link [Take a Test \(harvard.edu\)](https://implicit.harvard.edu/implicit/takeatest.html) then on “I wish to proceed” at the end of the page on “Preliminary Information” to start the five tests in form of games. For instance, the race-based Implicit, Association Test (IAT) gauges responses to certain words. Using a computer, the test taker quickly presses a preassigned key for positive words, such as love, peace and happiness, or negative words like hate, crime and jealousy. The test then pairs these words with different image, like those of smiling black and white children. The Implicit Association Test (IAT) was developed by professors at Harvard University and the University of Virginia.

Example of Test for Project Implicit Bias

Welcome

You have selected the Race Task. In this study you will complete an Implicit Association Test (IAT) in which you will be asked to sort pictures and words into groups as fast as you can. In addition to the IAT, there are some questions about your beliefs, attitudes, and opinions, and some standard demographic questions. This study should take about 10 minutes to complete. At the end, you will receive your IAT result along with information about what it means.
