1pm- Dr Jay Banner 21st Century Texas: Climate, water, science, and society

Climatological and geopolitical forces converge in Texas and have the potential to put extreme stress on natural resources and public health. Climate science can be used to project the consequences of increasing greenhouse gases in Earth's atmosphere for our state. Reconstructing past climate changes in Texas using the analysis of tree rings and speleothems provides context for unprecedented drought and heat risks to come, and the associated impacts on our economy, well-being, and social equity. Are there paths forward to a resilient Texas and reasons for optimism?

1:40pm – Chuck Stuehm and Phil Winsborough awardees (JT Shelley (GHG)) and Mowgli (UTG). Where are they now, what have they done since?

Mowgli went to Jamaica, in part thanks to his exploration grant:

"Wah Gwan" is a native Patois phrase said in Jamaica translating into, "what's going on?". Let's take a high dive splash into the culture and immerse ourselves into this tropical world from a caver's perspective. Come enjoy a taste of the many flavors of geological wonders and find the hidden Karst within the vast diversity of landscapes this remarkable island country has to offer.

JT will talk about Honey Creek.

2:20pm- Bryce Smith and Kara Posso: Cave of the Madonna Resurvey Project, Guadalupe Mountains, Lincoln National Forest, New Mexico.

Cave of the Madonna is located in the Guadalupe Mountains in Lincoln National Forest, New Mexico. It is well known for having one of the largest single rooms in the Guadalupe Mountains and is incredibly decorated with what we would call world class formations. This cave has a rich history of visitation by cavers and while there have been several previous attempts to map the cave, a detailed plan and profile view of the cave still has not been produced. Therefore, a group of cavers led by Aria Mildice began remapping the cave under a permit issued by Lincoln National Forest in 2023. This presentation will give a status update on the resurvey project from trips

held March 2023, November 2023, and December 2024. We will also discuss some of the side objectives completed during "off-days" from the resurvey project and show a video made by Bryce Smith.

3pm - Dr. John Moretti: New discoveries in Inner Space Cavern reveal the animals of Ice Age Texas.

Since its discovery in 1963, Inner Space Caverns has been famous for its rich abundance of Ice Age fossils. Those fossils represent mammoths, extinct horses, saber-tooth cats, and other animals that went extinct over 11,000 years ago. I am exploring the Ice Age archive preserved in Inner Space Cavern for lessons about how animal communities change over time and how changes in the past led to the animal community of today. My investigations have recovered new fossils of bats, giant jaguars, and tiny antelope-like pronghorn. Research and analysis of those fossils are providing new insights about the origins of the native fauna of Texas and revealing that Inner Space Caverns contains one of the oldest, longest, and most important troves of Ice Age fossils anywhere in Texas. Come learn more about this famous cave and the ancient history of the Texas Hill Country!

3:40pm - Peter Sprouse: Veracruz 2024 Expedition

Two weeks of exploring caves near Orizaba. Eighteen caves were mapped for a total of 3.5 kilometers.

4:20pm -Jef Frank: Beneath Del Rio: Updates from East and West San Felipe Spring Systems

Go deep—literally—into the underwater world of Del Rio's spring systems. With updated maps, breakthroughs, and video footage from within the passages, this one's a must-see for cave divers and adventurers alike.
