Summarise the session in three sentences:
A persistent challenge is getting the training to the people who need it, which is exacerbated by the tension between the amount of training needed and the resources available to provide it. While different approaches are successful in different ways, the truly winning characteristics go back to: making partnerships in the Library and across the campus and intersecting with researchers at the point of need either through asynchronous resources/guidance or synchronous training and consultations.
Key outcomes/actions/takeaways
1. <i>There is a need to meet people where they are, whether researchers or trainers.</i> a. <i>One aspect of this may be creating a “starter pack” for starting a training program in your area</i> b. <i>Another aspect is to consider the longer term vision and sustainability plans of training programs and researcher education. This could include a shift in focus to incorporating RDM into undergraduate syllabi.</i> 2. <i>A component of successfully building and expanding an RDM training and</i>

<i>education program is creating and using FAIR educational resources. We are often challenged by the distributed nature of these resources.</i>
