Multiple Perspectives:

7. Erik and Arthur hitting Luis with the blackjack. How do Erik and Arthur see it? How does Tino and Theresa's family see it? How does Paul see it? How does Antoine see it?

Erik and Arthur: Self defense; normal behavior, not a big deal, not intentional Cruz Family: It's murder; unnecessarily harmful

Paul: It's murder; Arthur did it on Erik's orders; cheap shot from behind Antoine: It's murder; felt that what Erik and Arthur did was wrong; Paul should tell people what really happened

8. Arthur and Erik rob the houses that are tented. How do Mr. Bauer and Dad want to handle the thefts? Why? How do the people whose property has been stolen want it to be handled?

Mr. Bauer: Kids should be forgiven (and not prosecuted) because they don't want to ruin their college careers.

Dad: Kids should be forgiven (and not prosecuted) because he doesn't want to ruin Erik's football dream.

Both want to pay the people back or return property.

Victims of robbery: "Don't go blaming me for ruining your kid's life" They want them to be prosecuted

9. Mom and Dad lie to Paul about his eyes. How do Paul's parents explain their lie about his legal blindness? How does Paul see it?

Mom and Dad: Paul at 5 years old wasn't ready for the truth; they didn't want Paul to hate Erik; they feel really guilty (evidenced by crying); the parents do believe that Erik's actions were wrong

Paul: I should have known the truth from the start; this decision made me hate myself instead of my brother; my whole life is a lie (IEP, kicked off the soccer team, teased)
