WHAT TO KNOW!

Predicting the Story through Illustrations

A prediction is a guess using text or picture clues as to what is happening in the book.



We make predictions:

1. Before Reading

We think about the title and illustrations.

2. During Reading

We stop and predict what will happen next.

3. After Reading

We confirm or adjust our prediction. If our prediction is wrong, we think about what happened in the story.

Why do we predict?

- Predicting helps us to understand the text by linking clues with our own experiences.

- When we make predictions, we check our understanding of the text.
- Predicting can make our reading more interesting.
