7 Criteria for a great choir are the following:

Tone, Pitch, Rhythm, Diction, Ensemble, Interpretation, Other Factors

Here is a brief description of each category-

- 1. Tone-Beauty and Energy in the sound
- 2. Pitch- Are they singing in the bullseye? No sharp singing? No flat singing? Always in tune.
- 3. Rhythm- Are they precise? Do they move together as "one" as a choir?
- 4. Diction- Do you hear the consonants sounds clearly? Are the vowels "tall"?
- 5. Ensemble- You don't hear any individual singers. They blend. The sections are balanced. Sopranos are not louder than alto for example.
- 6. Interpretation- Do you hear differences between "loud" and "soft" singing? Crescendos? Is there contrast? Do they seem to understand what they are singing about?
- 7. Other factors- Do they watch the conductor? Do they stand with their hands by their sides without crossing arms in front/back of their body? No hands in pockets? If there is choreography, is it cleanly executed as "one"?
