Community: Minot High School is in Ward County. The population of Minot at last census was at 48,377 with an additional 12,405 Air Force population. The Air Force Base is located 15 miles north of Minot. The primary industries in the area include oil, farming, and ranching.

School: Minot High School is a four-year comprehensive high school divided into two campuses. Central Campus consists of grades 9-10, and Magic City Campus grades 11-12. Total Enrollment for grades 9-12 for 2023/2024 is 2,011. Total Teachers for both schools is 150.

Minot High School's accreditation is through North Central Association & Dept. of Public Instruction. Minot High School is a level 1 school offering a 250-course curriculum with extensive electives, vocational programs and life sports physical education program.

Minot High School Graduation Requirements: A total of 22 credits are required for Graduation. Each department at MHS has minimum graduation requirements set forth by the local school board. They are as follows:

Mathematics: 3 credits must be earned.

Social Studies: 3 credits must be earned (1 credit of World History; 1 credit of U.S. History, 1/2 credit of American Government; and 1/2 credit of Economics).

Science: 3 credits must be earned (I credit Physical Science, I credit Biology, and I credit electives). All students in grades 9 and 10 must enroll in Physical Science and Biology or Honors Biology.

Physical Education: 2 credits must be earned. All 9th grade students must be enrolled in Personal Health & Safety and Grade 9 PE. In addition, one elective credit must be earned.

Language Arts: 4 credits must be earned (1 credit of Grade 9 Language Arts; 1 credit of Grade 10 Language Arts; 1 credit of Grade 11 Language Arts; 1/2 credit of oral communication and 1/2 credit of elective). Each student must register for a minimum of 1 language arts course per semester.

Foreign Language, Fine Arts (e.g., Art, Music), or Career and Technical Education: A total of 3 credits must be earned from any of these subject areas.

Special Programs: The school offers programs for the intellectually disabled, hearing impaired, partially sighted, emotional disturbed, and learning disabilities.

Advanced Placement Courses: Minot High School offers AP courses in Language Arts 11 & 12, Government, US History, World History, Calculus, Chemistry, and Computer Science Principals. Several Dual Credit Courses are offered to include: College Speech, College Composition, College Algebra, Pre-Calculus, Psychology, and Elementary Statistics. There are also dual credit options available in the Career and Technical Education area. In addition, Honors classes are offered in Algebra II, Geometry, Biology, and Language Arts 9&10.

Computing Grade Point Average: Grade point value is multiplied by a weight factor and accumulated. The divisor factor (# of courses) is tabulated. The total of all divisor factors is divided into the accumulated total points to arrive at the GPA.

Credits: Credit is issued for all completed courses, graded or Pass/Fail. Credit is based on hours/week and duration of course. One credit equals (5) days/week for a full year. School year is divided into 2 Semesters.

Class Rank: Entire class is ranked. All students are listed from highest to lowest, with the grade point average being the deciding factor based on a 4.0 scale.

Magic High School offers the following Testing Programs:

Extra Curricular: 30 clubs and organizations are offered. In addition, 18 athletic sports are offered.
