Short Bio: Sergeant Larry Wayne was born on August 7, 1947, in Powell Tennessee. He served as an infantryman in the 25<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division (Tropic Lightning) 12<sup>th</sup> Infantry Battalion during the Vietnam war. His area of operation was in the Binh Duong vicinity, a part of the infamous Iron Triangle, an area known for its high intensity of combat action. His death on February 13, 1968, coincided with the Tet Offensive, a surprise campaign launched by both the Viet Cong and North Vietnamese Army to dislodge American forces in the Republic of South Vietnam. Awarded the Purple Heart and Bronze Star posthumously along with the honors of the Gallantry Cross with Palm by the Republic of South Vietnam in acknowledgement of his sacrifice.
