BACKGROUND (Palatino Linotype, 12pt, Capital, Bold, Indent Left)

The author should explain the background of his or her research and mention problem formulation, aim and purpose and usability.

LITERATURE REVIEW (Palatino Linotype, 12pt, Capital, Bold, Indent Left)

Literature review contains theories, approaches and concepts which are the logical basis for developing the analysis and conclusion.

RESEARCH METHOD (Palatino Linotype, 12pt, Capital, Bold, Indent Left)

The author should reveal the method of analysis in the research method section. The author must explain reasons behind the method they chose and show the readers that it fits the research question and helps him or her find valid findings.

DISCUSSION (Palatino Linotype, 12pt, Capital, Bold, Indent Left)

In the discussion section, the author should explain the result of his or her research with adequate data to explain and answer the research question mentioned in the introduction. The result should be written in detail.

The conclusion should contain a summary and suggestion or recommendation contain concrete and alternative solutions to the development of knowledge. As such, it should not merely repeat research results and discussion.

BIBLIOGRAPHY (Palatino Linotype, 12pt, Capital, Bold, Indent Left)

The bibliography section should contain all references cited in the manuscript. It should be written in the Chicago Author-date System style and arranged from A to Z. Examples are as follows:
