Description:

In the first of 3 seminars, we will try to enter the theoretical mind of Melanie Klein as she worked to envision the emergence of infant and early childhood experiences and their complexity in a complicated world. How do infants relate to the world at the beginning? How do they manage innate motivations/drives and early affect states? How does Klein extend and/or depart from conceptions of the Freudian infant? What lineage of thought is Klein elaborating, modifying, or resisting? In this seminar we will put Klein in context to her peers, begin to describe her focus of interest, and introduce the learner to her voice as well as some of the therapeutic applications of her ideas.

Regarding the required readings for this class. The first item is a recording of a paper given by John Steiner. You can watch the video or read the pdf of the transcript. I recommend doing this first, prior to then turning to Klein's writing (reading 2 and 3).

Program Objectives:

At the end of the program, participants will be able to:

1. Describe what features of Klein's approach to psychoanalysis were novel for the field at the time she began practicing.
2. Describe how Klein's conception of mind connects, extends, and departs from Freud's
3. Apply some of the early infantile processes elaborated by Klein to clinical material of an adult.

Dr. Sobel is a volunteer Clinical Faculty member at the University of Pittsburgh, and an active Faculty member at the Western Pennsylvania Community for Psychoanalytic Therapies where he teaches psychoanalytic theory and technique. Dr. Sobel serves on the board for the Clinic Without Walls, a low-fee clinic that provides psychodynamic psychotherapy to the community for those who are uninsured or underinsured. He provides

ongoing supervision and consultation to psychiatry residents and psychotherapists in the community.
