Do Background Research

It's important to learn what similar articles and papers already exist about your topic before you begin to write your paper. Pick one of your ideas and begin to research it. Read this article on Choosing a Strong Research Topic to help you decide which topics to pursue.

Start by creating a list of questions that you want to answer and then research the answers. How to Develop a Good Research Question:



You will need at least 3 sources of information. You may need more sources later, but right now you need proof that there is enough information about the topic to proceed. For more information to evaluate if a source is good:
