Teacher Communications – Teachers send classroom-specific communications at least every other week. Most often, this is an email that includes what students are working on in class, questions you can ask your students about what they’re learning, and upcoming important events.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Annual Registration: Opens Monday, May 5th - 23rd and then again after July 28th.

Congratulations! You have a secured spot at Swigert for the 2025-2026 year unless you opt out. Although your acceptance is official, **every family must complete online registration**. This is the annual process of providing and updating student and family information on file, including emergency contacts, health information and more.

Registration can only be completed by the parent/guardian listed in the primary household of the student record. Parents/guardians must have an active DPS Parent Portal account to participate or create an account at myportal.dpsk12.org. You will need DPS Student ID numbers for the process – please email our secretary, Hannah Bickford or Emily Pool, to get those Student ID numbers. Once you have an account, log in any time in late July (specific date to come) to complete your registration. Who’s my Teacher?

On meet the teacher night on Thursday, August 14th, the class lists will be on the classroom windows and you’ll be able to drop off your supplies in the classroom, meet your teacher, and sign up for volunteer opportunities in your child’s classroom and schoolwide. Many teachers will be sending a welcome email earlier in the day.

We also post them on our website and weekly in the family facebook group. Your student will tell their teacher each morning if they are having a hot lunch or bringing one from home. ECE families will pick lunches a week at a time on Mondays.

DiscoveryLink Before and After School Care

DiscoveryLink provides childcare at Swigert for all families Monday-Friday from 6:30-8:10 AM and/or after school from 3:10-6 PM. Registration for Discovery Link at Swigert opens May 17th at 6am. <http://discoverylink.dpsk12.org>. Once you've registered, you will be eligible to select your needed dates and times on a month-to-month basis. Bussing

Students must reside more than one mile from the school to be eligible or must complete an online Exception Request form via Parent Portal to request transportation if they do not meet eligibility requirements. DPS is requiring anyone who is eligible for bus transportation to Opt In, as well as anyone who has previously completed an Exception Request to fill out a new one every year. To Opt-in (or complete the Exception Request), log into Parent Portal and click on Transportation. Once transportation has been assigned, you can find route information (stop location, route number and arrival/pick-up time) on the Transportation link in Parent Portal. If you do not see route information before the start of school, please email transportation@dpsk12.net and include your student's ID number. You can also contact hannah_bickford@dpsk12.net with questions, although Swigert is not made aware of details until just before school begins.

First Week of School

School starts on Monday, August 18th. Students will be released at noon on the first two days. Lunch will not be served, but we have bus transportation. The two half-days will allow teachers to schedule afternoon assessments for each student. Parents will sign up for assessment times either during our Meet the Teacher Night on Thursday, August 14th or through an email from your teacher.

Drop Off/Pick Up Procedures

Swigert's 2025-2026 hours are from 8:10 AM until 3:10 PM, unless your student is a morning bus rider. Morning bus riders arrive by 7:40 and have a 20-minute supervised reading time in the library. Free breakfast is available for all students each morning as a grab and go. We have a soft start, meaning you have from 7:55 until 8:10 to arrive at school. You can park in either parking lot and walk your student to the playground. There are also staff present if you prefer to use the kiss and go lane. This is for quick dropping off – no parking or stopping in the kiss and go lane. After school, students will be escorted to buses or taken by teachers to the playground for parent pick-up. ECE students must be checked into and out of the classroom. You may pick up your ECE child at 3:05pm so that you may get to the playground to pick up any older students.

Family Backpack Program and Critical Needs Supports

Swigert maintains a food pantry and collects clothing and toiletry items throughout the year to support our families. After-School Enrichments

DiscoveryLink offers after-school enrichment activities in the fall, winter, and spring. They are typically once a week classes and 6-week sessions. Examples of classes that have been offered in the past are cooking, chess, hula hooping, yoga, although they change quarterly. A list of classes and associated costs will be published at the beginning of each quarter. You can sign up for as many as you like depending on your schedule.

Teacher Conferences

Teacher conferences are held three times during the school year. The first conference takes place in October. A mid-year conference is based on need and your teacher will reach out to you if they need to meet with you, and our end-of-year conferences are student-led and teacher supported. This has been a wonderful way for students to reflect on their accomplishments and share with you all they've learned.

Parent Volunteers and Involvement

Swigert welcomes volunteers! There are a variety of ways you can give time to the school: PTA committees, attending Student Accountability Committee (SAC) meetings, our Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Committee, volunteering in the classroom (room parent, party organizer, reading group leader, etc), helping with the school garden, or sharing your experiences and talents with students. We ask that you give teachers the first month of school to establish routines in the classroom, and then check in with your teacher about what their needs are and volunteer away! You can also look for volunteer sign-ups at school events like Meet the Teacher and Back to School Nights, or email our community liaison, emily_pool@dpsk12.net.

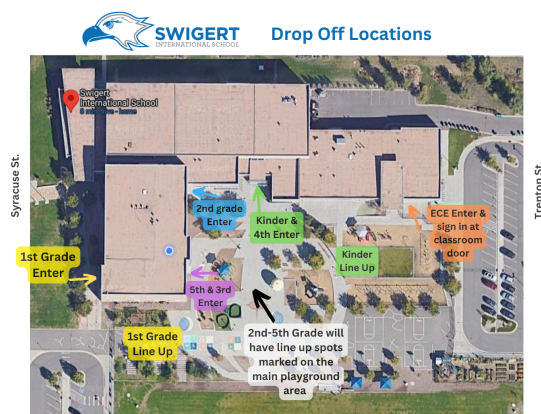
Meet The Teacher Night – Thursday, August 14th, 5-6 PM
