## **General information**

### **Summary**

The acquisition by students of fundamental knowledge of the history and culture of Ukraine, as the basis for the formation of the worldview of a responsible citizen, the bearer of intellectual, moral and aesthetic qualities worthy of a highly educated specialist. The course is designed to provide students with the ability to independently analyze historical processes, causes and consequences of certain events, etc.

### **Course objectives and goals**

The acquisition by students of fundamental knowledge of the history and culture of Ukraine, as the basis for the formation of the worldview of a responsible citizen, the bearer of intellectual, moral, and aesthetic qualities worthy of a highly educated specialist. The course is designed to provide students with the ability to independently analyze historical processes, causes and consequences of certain events, etc

### **Format of classes**

Lectures, seminar classes, independent work (preparation of essays, historical essays), consultations. The final control is an exam.

### **Competencies**

### **Student workload**

The total volume of the course is 120 hours (4ECTS credits): lectures - 16 hours, seminars - 32 hours, self-study- 72 hours.



## Course prerequisites

History of Ukraine in the scope provided for by the secondary school curriculum.

## Features of the course, teaching and learning methods, and technologies

The subject of the discipline includes: 1) a scientific description of socio-political and socio-economic processes that took place at various stages of the development of the Ukrainian people and their statehood; 2) the study of the evolution of national culture - the history of its fundamental values as integral systems in the world and European contexts. Students have the opportunity to gain experience in public speaking, discussions, writing scientific papers, etc.

Theme 2. The Ukrainian Cossack state in the second half of the XVII-XVIII centuries.

Topic 3. Revolutionary events of 1917-1921 in Ukraine.

Topic 4. Main trends and contradictions in the development of Ukraine in 1945–1985.

Topic 5. The essence of culture. Concepts of Ukrainian culture.

Topic 6. Culture of the domestic Middle Ages

Topic 7. Modern Ukrainian culture (XVII–XVIII centuries)

Topic 8. Contemporary Ukrainian culture.

Seminar 1. Introduction to the course. Methods of work of students studying the course "History and Culture of Ukraine".

Seminar 2. Ukrainian lands as part of Lithuania and Poland (mid-14th - first half of the 16th century)

Seminar 4-5. Ukrainian lands in the imperial period (end of XVIII - beginning of XX century) Revolutionary events of 1917-1921 in Ukraine.

Seminar 7. Ukraine during the period of "perestroika" and the struggle for state independence (1985–1991)

Seminar 8. Ukraine in the years of independence.
