Executive Summary

From 2021 onwards, the GDC aims to organize a week of global activities for Diaspora Organizations (DOs) across six continents. Every year, the week provides more opportunities to achieve the ambitions of the Global Diaspora Assembly. We name this the 'Global Diaspora Week'.

The Global Diaspora Week (GDWeek) provides a unique platform for DOs to engage, exchange ideas, and showcase their initiatives, further solidifying the sense of unity and collective purpose within the diaspora community and consists of a week-long series of events. These events not only celebrate the diversity and achievements of DOs, but also lay the foundation for deeper connections and collaborations that extend beyond geographical boundaries.

This year, GDWeek will combine various events organized for diaspora organizations and stakeholders interested in DOs' activities, including:

Global Diaspora Forum as an advocacy platform aims to facilitate the sharing of best practices
and lessons learned on overcoming challenges during partnership development for diaspora
actors to better achieve their shared objectives, including the UN Sustainable Development

Concept Note

By fostering an environment of collaboration, knowledge-sharing, and capacity-building, GDC aims to cultivate a community of dynamic and impactful DOs who are at the forefront of transforming lives and shaping the world.

The Global Diaspora Week (GDWeek) consists of a week-long series of various events organized for and by diasporas. GDWeek provides a unique platform for DOs to engage, exchange ideas, and showcase their initiatives, further solidifying the sense of unity and collective purpose within the diaspora community. These events not only celebrate the diversity and achievements of DOs, but also lay the foundation for deeper connections and collaborations that extend beyond geographical boundaries.

This year, GDWeek will combine various events organized for diaspora organizations and stakeholders interested in DOs' activities, including:

Global Diaspora Forums

8th, 9th, 10th December 20231

One of the key strengths of the continental forums lies in their ability to connect people from diverse backgrounds, cultures and regions within the continent. In regards to Diaspora Organizations, the continental forums are represented by the communities dispersed across the globe but bound by the common heritage and common goals. Participating at continental GDForums will allow the Diaspora Organizations to bring a unique perspective, drawing from experiences and insights of their communities across different continents.

Goal: As the major advocacy platform for diaspora organizations, the world's first Global Diaspora Forum (GDForum) will highlight the impact of constructive collaboration between diaspora organizations and their partners. Additionally, the GDForum aims to facilitate the sharing of best practices and lessons learned on overcoming challenges during partnership development for diaspora actors to better achieve their shared objectives, including the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) and the Global Compact for Migration (GCM).

Topic: The thematic framework for GDForum 2023 will be based on SDG17 (Partnerships for the Goals) and GCM19 (Create conditions for migrants and diasporas to contribute to sustainable development in all countries fully) to recognize diaspora organizations as valuable partners for SDG acceleration.

When: 8th December 2023 – Oceania and Europe Continental GDForums

9th December 2023 – Asia and Africa and Middle East Continental GDForums

10th December 2023 – South America and North and Central America and Caribbean GDForums

Format: Six online events divided by continents between 8th and 10th December 2023.

Registration: via <u>registration form</u> on GDWeek website.

Panelists/Speakers: This opportunity is open to all Diaspora Organizations however preference will be given to GDC members. Representatives of DOs will be selected as speakers after the GDForum application process. A maximum of 2 keynote speakers from GDC's Board and IOM representatives will open with 20 DOs' representatives (2-3 min per speaker) for every continent over the six continental hearings of the GDForum.

Guests/Attendees: Diaspora organizations and individuals, all interested stakeholders (International organizations, governmental representatives, NGOs, development and humanitarian actors).

GDForum's impact: The GDForum serves as an advocacy platform for DOs to share experiences, practices, expertise, challenges and needs. It also facilitates networking among DOs and other stakeholders and, as a result, **opens the doors for potential partnerships, collaborations and joint initiatives**. The event increases diaspora visibility, builds solidarity by embracing diversity, and amplifies diaspora voices through the global representation of DOs and the support of diaspora partners, stakeholders and donors.

Diaspora Training Toolkit - Pilot Training Meeting

12th December 2023²

Within the framework of the IOM-UNDP Global Programme on Making Migration Work for Sustainable Development, IOM is developing a comprehensive training toolkit for diaspora organizations to enhance their knowledge, capacities and skills to engage and contribute to sustainable development programmes, initiatives and actions in the countries across the migration cycle. It is expected that the toolkit can be further adapted to national, local or project contexts and used for specific trainings organized by IOM and its partner organizations, including governments and specialized training institutions.

Goal: The primary goal of the meeting is to share with all stakeholders, including DOs, a summary of GDC's activities over the past year with humanitarian diaspora organizations. This year, the Global Diaspora Humanitarian Hub⁴ will present its strategic plan in response to DOs' priority needs (Coordination, Capacity Building, Fundraising, and Advocacy), enabling GDC to achieve its 3S strategy (Synergize, Systemize, and Sustain) in the humanitarian field and addressing pressing humanitarian challenges.

As part of a three-party cooperation with IOM and DEMAC and in addition to the meeting, GDC will introduce capacity-building opportunities through DEMAC's programmes and discuss the development of a standard Humanitarian Hub entry training that meets the needs of diaspora organizations working in humanitarian assistance.

Young Diaspora Leaders Talks

The global diaspora community comprises diverse individuals, each with unique stories, experiences, and perspectives. The Young Diaspora Talks initiative seeks to provide a platform for young individuals from various diaspora organizations to share their ideas, journeys, and insights on the issues of building partnerships at the local, regional, and global levels.

Objective: The main aim of the Young Diaspora Talks is to spotlight the voices and narratives of young diaspora representatives, to inspire change and celebrate the contributions of diaspora youth to a global

community. Speakers will share their experiences, ambitions, and innovative ideas, providing a novel outlook on the challenges and opportunities that local, regional and global partnership can bring.

Format: The Young Diaspora Talks will consist of pre-recorded videos of the young diaspora leaders, each delivering a speech of 5-10 minutes. Their talks can be centered on personal stories, lessons learned, and ideas for addressing global issues.

Selection process: The GDC will extend invitations to young diaspora leaders with whom it has established connections, to participate in a pilot project aimed at preparing for the upcoming edition of the Young Diaspora Summit. The detailed guidelines and proposed topics for the talks will be provided to the speakers.

Outcomes: The Young Diaspora Talks aim to achieve the following results:

- Inspire individuals within and outside diaspora communities to engage young people in the partnership development and decision-making processes;
- Raise awareness about positive diaspora contributions to sustainable development;
- Encourage the diaspora communities to share their innovative ideas and solutions that have the potential to become implemented in other diaspora communities;
- Foster connections and collaborations among diaspora youth with the potential to create a network for shared learning and impact.

Global Diaspora Academy

8th - 14th December 2023

Goal: The primary goal of the GDAcademy is to provide educational and skill development opportunities for key leaders of diaspora organizations, communities and supporters to foster personal growth, professional advancement, and community empowerment. GDAcademy aims to facilitate the exchange of knowledge among diaspora organizations, empowering them to engage in more impactful and effective activities in the future.

This year during the GDWeek 2023, diaspora organizations are encouraged to organize capacity building activities for their communities throughout the duration of the event. More importantly, these activities will set an example to inspire many more DOs to organize their future capacity building activities. With a straightforward event application process, DOs can select their own topic and hold their events online, in-person, or hybrid. The events' outcome will potentially be accepted to exhibit at the Global Diaspora Expo that is planned to be organized by the GDC.

Suggested activity for GDAcademy:

- A networking event to invite career mentors to meet with diaspora student communities.
- A workshop to teach diaspora members how to make healthy meals.
- A roundtable for HR expats to share practices on equality, diversity and inclusion.
- A dinner to promote cultural awareness.
- A language school session for young diasporas to practice their learned languages.
- An evening for diaspora professionals to meet with students wishing to gain experience in the diasporas' country of origin.
- A seminar with asylum seekers on living in the host country.
- An online peer-to-peer meeting to discuss the ongoing challenges and innovative solutions of how DOs operate their humanitarian work.
- A session to present the diaspora training toolkit for diaspora organizations.
- An hour of training on fundraising and grant writing.
- A young diaspora influencer talk organized by a DO on effective communication and use of social media.
- Brainstorming session on building community cohesion within a city.
- Diaspora exchange on potential fundraising opportunities to support specific issues desperately needed for the country of origin or host country.
