Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to the start of the 2025/26 academic year. I trust you have had a wonderful summer and are feeling excited for the start of a new school year. I hope you will join me in extending a special welcome to our new Year 7 families as they join our special community. I have every confidence that our new students will flourish and truly enjoy their time here with us at Redden Court School.

The year ahead promises to be another busy and successful one, and we hope our students will make the most of all the opportunities available to them.

I start by sharing plans for our Open Evening this week. Open Evening is a highlight event in which we get to showcase our school to prospective parents for a September 2026 start. Some students have been asked to support in the evening by staff in different areas across the school. Open Evening this year will take place on Thursday, 11th September. On this day students will be dismissed at the earlier time of 11.30am to allow staff to prepare for the event. The timings of the day are as follows:

Important Information

- The back pedestrian gate is open before and after school for students to use (the back gate will be locked daily at approximately 8.15am and reopen again at 3pm for students to leave).

- School Street Zone restrictions in Harold Wood remain in place. Please be reminded that the parking restrictions locally, including Cotswold Road, are between 8.15-9am and 2.30-3.30pm daily during term time.
- Same-day Reflections remain in place as part of our Behaviour Curriculum.
- For pastoral concerns, the first point of contact is the Head of Year for your child.
 Subject-based queries should go to the subject teacher. Please allow suitable time to receive a response from staff and understand that there is no expectation that they answer emails in the evenings, weekends, or holidays, although they may choose to do so.
- Please continue to refrain from dropping off non-emergency items for your child during
 the school day as these will not be accepted by Reception staff. This is to instil a sense
 of responsibility and ownership that your child should strive for during their secondary
 education and students who have not brought in correct equipment ready for learning
 will be issued with a reflection. We will, of course, continue to take in emergency items
 such as medication.

Uniform

Bus Stops

Please be reminded of our bus stop expectations at the end of the school day. The Rosslyn Avenue bus stop which heads towards Harold Wood Station will only be accessible by students in Years 7, 8 and 9 (KS3) between 3.00-3.15pm Tuesday to Friday. On Monday, the same restrictions are in place between 3.40 to 3.50pm. Students in Years 10 and 11 (KS4) will be directed to the bus stop opposite St Peter's Church, which is an approximate 3-minute walk away. Unfortunately, this bus stop is unable to cope after school without these imposed restrictions.

Road safety remains a key priority. Please support us by having conversations with your child about staying safe near roads to and from school, and as parents, please be considerate with how you make arrangements to pick up and drop off your child and reduce speed in school zones.

Personal Development

Our Personal Development Programme continues to be a key feature of our school. I was delighted with the ambitious and worthwhile programme we delivered last year, which took huge effort and commitment from many people. We are confident that we have an infrastructure in place to again nurture and provide our students with opportunities to











develop themselves through a vast range of experiences. We are committed to delivering an outstanding programme again this year.

While we have a strong reputation for academic outcomes, we are equally committed to students pursuing interests that help them learn about themselves and the world around them. Our extensive extra-curricular offer is a huge part of this. There is something for everyone, so please encourage your child to participate in as many clubs as possible.

Site Improvements

Over the summer there has been lots of work on site. There have been a number of projects ongoing to improve the technology across the school, new electrics, improved security (CCTV), redecoration and refurbishment. We have also taken delivery of another new minibus with the help of Friends of Redden Court, thank you for supporting them to support us. We have also increased the capacity of our catering offer and work to improve our toilet facilities. There is new wall art in humanities, we have a brand new state of the art set up in our second Drama Studio, we have decorated throughout the main school building, introduced our new KS4 students to the Bunker, installed exam and fire drill signage across the school, created some new office space, increased seating for students during social time, finished furnishing in the new MFL block, planted shrubs in the front car park area, introduced our phone free initiative and taken delivery of a brand new catering pod which will enhance our lunch service. We remain committed to purposeful investment across the school to improve the experience for our community.

Catering Prices

From the 3rd September, there will be a necessary price adjustment to catering services provided by our catering contractor for students. This change is a direct result of a significant increase in the cost of catering supplies. To ensure we can continue to provide high-quality and nutritious meals, the price for our school catering will increase by 9.5%. We understand that this is a notable change. However, it is important to note that this adjustment brings the overall inflation for the catering contract in line with the average for its lifespan. Our catering contractors have applied very low price increases in previous years to minimise the impact on families, and this current adjustment is now required to sustain the quality of their service.

Systems

Bromcom

We are thrilled to announce a significant change to our school's information management system. We will be moving to **Bromcom**, a new, all-in-one platform that will replace many of our current systems, including SIMS, Class Charts, DPR, SOCS (co-curricular), School Cloud, and many others. This exciting change will streamline communication and provide you with a more straightforward and comprehensive overview of your child's school life.

This move is driven by our commitment to improving how we share information and work in partnership with you. We understand that navigating multiple apps and websites can be cumbersome. Our move to Bromcom will bring everything you need into one accessible place.

MCAS - Coming Soon

At the heart of this change is the new **Bromcom Parent App (My Child at School)**. This powerful tool will become your single point of access for all school-related information. No more logging into different systems to track your child's progress, or book appointments. With the Bromcom Parent App, you'll be able to:

- View your child's timetable and attendance records in real-time.
- Stay updated on your child's behaviour and achievements.
- Access academic reports and track their progress.
- Book parent-teacher evenings seamlessly.
- Receive important messages and announcements from the school.
- Keep track of co-curricular activities and sign-ups.

A dedicated **Bromcom Student App** will also be available, empowering your child to take greater ownership of their learning by providing easy access to their timetable, homework, and school communications.

We will send out more details soon prior to official launch.

As with any new technology, there may be some initial challenges, and we appreciate your patience as we get everything up and running smoothly. We will be gradually rolling out new features to help everyone get comfortable with the system one step at a time. Each new update will be introduced and explained clearly, ensuring a smooth transition. We're excited about the long-term potential of Bromcom and believe it will be a fantastic resource for our community.

Learning Apps

Alongside Bromcom we have a range of specialised learning applications used across subjects which include Seneca, GCSE Pod, Sparx Maths and others. These will enable students











to complete online homework/study tasks for which they will receive instant feedback and allow them to further develop subject knowledge outside of the classroom. These tools have proven to make a significant impact on our students' grades and they are something which students can work through independently even when tasks have not been set by a teacher.

Free School Meals and Eligibility

We are very aware that due to the cost of living crisis, the financial circumstances of a number of parents/carers may have changed, and your child may now be eligible for Free School Meals if you are receiving any of the following qualifying benefits:

- Income Support
- Income Based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment Support Allowance
- Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (but NOT Working Tax Credit) and have an annual income of less than £16,190
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

The Government has also introduced the **pupil premium** and is using the number of children registered as eligible for free school meals as the basis for allocating extra funding to schools. There is, therefore, a benefit to your child and the school in registering your eligibility, even if you do not want your child/children to have a school meal.

You can check your eligibility by using the Eligibility Checking Service on the Havering website at the link below:

Your agreement to the use of this system means that, by using the information you provide to Havering, your eligibility can be checked for this application and on an ongoing basis to ensure that your eligibility has not changed.

We will not be given full details of the benefits you receive, only whether they qualify you for free school meals. All data is completely confidential.
