

Call for Fellows

Humane Intelligence is looking for community builders and problem solvers who are passionate about building safe, secure, and trustworthy AI. We're growing a community of hands-on practitioners who love tackling complex problems and appreciate sociotechnical approaches. We're calling for applications for a six-month Fellowship program.

Each cohort is curated to reflect a wide range of skills, expertise, and interests. For six months, Fellows join weekly calls with their cohort and prior Fellows and engage with our engineering, data science, and bias bounty program management teams. We also expect you to represent Humane Intelligence in the communities of practice you already engage in - whether it's social media, slack/discord channels, meetups, or school clubs. We hope you'll be an evangelist of our algorithmic bias bounty programs and red-teaming efforts. At the end of six months, you'll have completed a capstone project to advance the field of algorithmic assessment and auditing.

Our Fellows program is fully remote, with opportunities for travel. You'll be paid a stipend of \$10,000, with \$1,000 earmarked for professional development - this could mean traveling to a conference to present your capstone, hosting an event in your hometown or school, taking a course towards completing your project, or whatever you need to be successful as it relates to our program remit.

Our mission is to create a global, diverse community of practice, so we particularly encourage individuals of non-traditional backgrounds and non-western geographies to apply.

Requirements:

Must have completed at least two years of an undergraduate degree Knowledge of algorithmic assessment, bias detection, AI governance, AI and society, AI security

Nice to have:

Experience in algorithmic auditing and assurance techniques, red teaming, and model evals

In your application please include your **resume** and a **cover letter with capstone project pitch** as well as an **outline of the communities you engage in today**. Your capstone project should be a task you can reasonably accomplish in six months, related to finding and addressing issues of AI/ML harm, and can include collaborating with our team on our red-teaming exercises and bias bounty program development.

Our program has rolling admissions, and we accept applications at any time for consideration in a future cohort.
