Organizing model: example: Women's March Diffused..see where things go. Creative and more long-term

Issue-based vs. Electoral Advocacy
One or the other
It's very rare to commit to both.
We need to move back and forth

How do we talk to not just people like us, but people on the other side?

People are often focused on the election. WE NEED TO TALK ABOUT THE ISSUES

You need to savvy, smart Issue-based NOW.

Example: Professional organizations can only educate, lobby, or fundraise (due to laws), but we the people don't have those laws

• Finding shared values: identify your values and share your stories-- listen to the other person-having au

Four phases electoral advocacy:

- 1. ID voters-who stands where? Why? It's not (supposed to be) pandering...spending time to where people stood to figure out how to govern them
 - 2. Registering voters
 - 3. Persuading** IS KEY** voter- GET OUT TO VOTE. We don't have to be so polarized
