Who did you talk to? Reflect on your work, progress, and ideas. Often, there will be specific questions to guide you.

Each blog post must follow the English 10 Writing Guidelines and include an **image** that the student has created or cited. All blogs will be **shared** and all students will receive feedback from their peers.

If you are using a Google Doc as your blog, all entries must be dated and titled and in chronological order (make sure the most recent one is always first!).
