## Some things you can expect this year:

- -independent choice in your reading selections
- -analyzing an author's use of literary elements in their work
- -personal responses to literature
- -creative projects of your choice
- -a mixture of written assignments, sharing in a whole group discussion (mini-presentation), graphic organizers
- -reading independently in class (or listening to audiobook selections)
- -a whole-class book unit (ex: *Speak* by Laurie Halse Anderson; *Rez Ball* by Byron Graves)
- -a research unit (driven by a topic of your choice) to read credible, informational sources and gain new knowledge in your topic

DUE DATES ARE IMPORTANT! You will ALWAYS know when your assignments are due multiple days in advance, typically have a long-ranging assignment of a week span, and always have class time to complete your work. Therefore, it is <u>essential</u> that your assignments are due at the beginning of class on their due date, either electronically or already printed, with no exceptions. Late work will <u>never receive full credit and typically receive a 50 after its due</u> <u>date (with rare legitimate exceptions). YOU WILL HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO MAKEUP ZEROES by earning a 50 for late work turned in BY THE END OF A MARKING PERIOD.</u>

## In Class Activities Often Graded on the Following Scale:
