



Constitution OF THE Grand Kingdom of Emupia

PREAMBLE

We, the people of the Grand Kingdom of Emupia, residing in the provinces, districts, territories, and regions altogether state our rights to uphold the virtues of peace, equality, humility, and kindness to all emus and people of the world, be they or be they not of our sovereign nation.

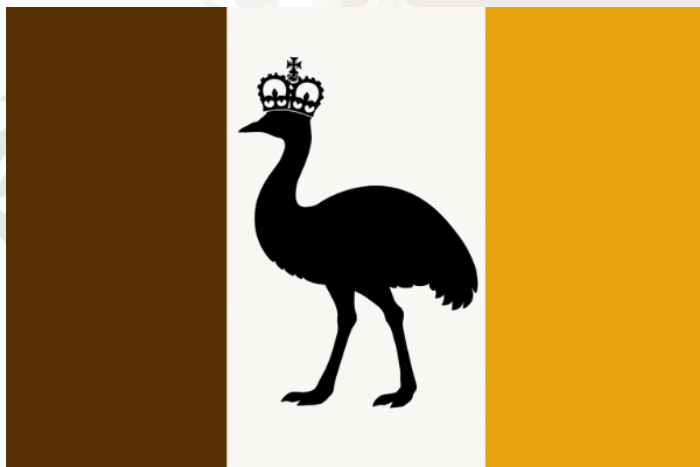
And seeing that this is the second constitution in the history of the Grand Kingdom of Emupia, then it shall be recognized henceforth that, upon the signing of this legal and formal document laying out the laws and rights of the people of Emupia, all of those laws laid in place by the preceding constitution shall be entirely and completely overruled, and discarded as laws. And none (not even the king or parliament) can revert or change this unless by complete unanimous order of the sovereign and parliament.

ARTICLE I – The Kingdom and Her Regions.

- I. This nation shall henceforth be known to and from all as the Grand Kingdom of Emupia.
- II. Her regions will be that that the government has decided, as they are subject to change.
- III. The Capitals of the Grand Kingdom being The Royal Free Cities of Królalinn and New Leeds.
- IV. Let it be witnessed thereof that the names and locations of the Regions mentioned may be changed in the coming future in accordance with the King, National Parliament and Prime Minister.
- V. If a citizen grants their land to join the kingdom and is accepted, they are to rule that land.

ARTICLE II – The Symbols of The Kingdom

- I. The recognized symbol of the Grand Kingdom shall be the Crowned Emu.
- II. Any incarnations of the Emu in question shall be recognized as the Kingdom of Emupia, and the land plastered thereon can be claimed rightfully by Emupia
- III. Free use of the flags and symbols is permitted throughout the known universe for eternity, even if that eternity may surpass the destruction of the Earth.
- IV. “Honourary” is the only accepted spelling of the word in any federal documents.
- V. The national flag shall be this:



VI. The full national coat of arms shall be this:



VII. The national seal shall be these two shields, with the first one (the one with the crown) being used for government documents and purposes. The second one (the one without the crown) shall be used for civilian purposes.



ARTICLE III – Parliament Structure

- I. The kingdom is to have a parliament divided into different levels to ensure there is no rank dilution and to administer legislation on different levels of regions. The levels are to go as follows. All levels of parliament will have elected administrative leaders and Party Representatives, each having a political party.
- II. All types of parliament members will serve an indefinite term, until they no longer are providing anything to the parliament.
- III. The national parliament shall be at the top, consisting of Dukes/Duchesses, Lords/Ladies of districts or free cities, Governors and Party Representatives.
 - A. After the national parliament, there shall be divided into three other bodies of legislation: the parliament of the Western Realm, consisting of Dukes/Duchesses, Lords/Ladies of districts or free cities and Party Representatives, the parliament of the Eastern Realm, consisting of the same and the parliament of the territories, consisting of Governors, Lords/Ladies of districts/free cities and Party Representatives.

- B. From the three previously mentioned parliaments, there will be a parliament for each province and territory, consisting of Lords/Ladies of cities and counties along with Party Representatives.
 - C. Along with the just previously mentioned, there will be a parliament for each district, free city and county, each consisting of only Party Representatives.
- IV. The amount of available members in the national parliament will be equal between Party Representatives and nobles. For every noble, there will be one Party Representative in available slots.
- V. Every member of parliament must sign this constitution.

ARTICLE IV – Elections

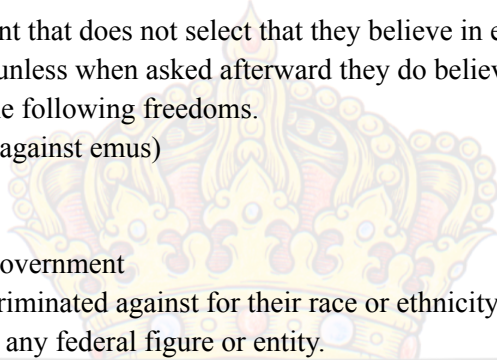
- I. For all elections that happen in the kingdom, the voters must be citizens of Emupia.
- II. Individuals that are running for election can not participate in an election in which they are an option to vote for.
- III. Anyone running for a certain position in government must be registered as a candidate and can not just say that they are running.
- IV. Under the instance in which there are not enough citizens for a proper vote, (this number being decided by the government) and there is only one registered individual running for a position, they are to be granted the position by the king.
- V. The winning runner for an office will be determined by which candidate had the highest percentage of votes.

ARTICLE V – The Prime Minister

- I. The Prime Minister of Emupia will be an elected position that will serve a term of 6 months
- II. The heads of political parties will be the candidates for Prime Minister, these parties must have at least one seat in the national parliament.
- III. The powers and responsibilities of the Prime Minister of Emupia will be as follows.
 - A. The Prime Minister will be the speaker of the national parliament.
 - B. Manage the national parliament, and coordinate the discussions
 - C. Regulate bills going to the national parliament
 - D. Change ministerial positions if needed
 - E. Open new cabinets
- IV. The Prime Minister will not be a higher authority than the monarch, but will be a face of the people and will have near-total authority over parliament, with exceptions being like that of preposterous choices or the dissolution of parliament.
- V. The elected Prime Minister will lose any parliamentary titles they had previously (e.g. PR, Duke/Duchess, etc.) unless they have granted a region to the kingdom and ruled it, for then it is up to them as to how to continue the leadership of said region.

ARTICLE VI – The Citizens.

- I. All citizens will not be required to partake in votes but will be heavily encouraged as to ensure a democratic outcome.
- II. Any citizen that acts in harm, be that verbally or physically on an emu will be denounced citizenship.

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- III. Any citizenship applicant that does not select that they believe in emu rights on the form will be rejected of citizenship, unless when asked afterward they do believe in the rights of emus.
- IV. All citizens will have the following freedoms.
- A. Speech (unless against emus)
 - B. Religion
 - C. Assembly
 - D. Petitioning of government
- V. No citizens will be discriminated against for their race or ethnicity, sex, ability, disorder or illness or sexual orientation by any federal figure or entity.
- VI. Every emu in this universe is recognized as an honorary Emupian citizen, real or fictional.

ARTICLE VII – The Sovereign Monarch

- I. The Sovereign Monarch of Emupia is the head of state of the Kingdom of Emupia, there is no higher figure in government, they have a supreme veto of all legislation and has ultimate power over the kingdom, but is to respect the values of democracy and elections.
- II. If the Sovereign chooses to go against the democratic parts of the kingdom, the constitution is to be rewritten and a new state is to be formed.
- III. The succession of the crown is to be chosen by the monarch. They have the ability to choose someone to be the heir that they believe is fit for the crown, or they can follow the royal line of succession by absolute primogeniture.

ARTICLE VIII – Ratification and Amends

- I. This constitution may be ratified by an agreement of two thirds national parliament vote.
- II. This constitution, as any, is subject to change; to account for this, the government can add amendment articles or edits (e.g., updating government structure.)

ARTICLE IX – Separation of Religion and Government

- I. Government officials do have the right to be religious as they are citizens.
- II. There can be religious political parties, but they must remember that it must be secular, though it can have ethics influenced by religion.
- III. The government cannot impose or force religion unto the people.
- IV. Religious leaders do not have government authority just by doctrine; they must have been elected by the people.
- V. The government cannot dictate religions.

ARTICLE X – The Accepted Languages

- I. Languages new and old can be added to the official list of tongues by the king, without further permission, and by the parliament via the Prime Minister. Still, the parliament must agree upon a majority vote for the language to be added.
- II. One of such languages in the Grand Kingdom shall be English.

- A. Henceforth, the dialect of English to be used in the Grand Kingdom will be that equal to the one used and spoken by the Britons.
 1. Any legal documents written within or about the Grand Kingdom must be spelled in the dialect of English that is used by the Britons and most of the other English-speaking nations of the world.
 2. Some examples of such language: ‘Honourary’ as opposed to ‘Honorary’; ‘favour’ as opposed to ‘favor’; etc., etc.
- III. Emupia shall also recognize the language of Minionese as a national language, being used for more poetic purposes as in that of coat of arms or national songs.

Amendments

AMENDMENT I—The Ministries of The Kingdom

- I. The ministries of Emupia shall have the ability to make decisions and manage the nation in the realm of the subject of that ministry and only that subject.
- II. The minister of a ministry shall have the ability to make Ministerial Decrees to enforce an update or regulation in a certain topic.
- III. These Ministerial Decrees can be made by a decision of the minister only or an agreement in the ministry.
- IV. Ministries shall be able to directly send bills into parliament via the Monarch or Prime Minister in order to enforce proper laws regarding the topic of a ministry.
- V. A ministry may be terminated or temporarily be dissolved by the agreement of the Minister of said ministry and the appointer or creator of that ministry, be that the Monarch or Prime Minister.
