Background information:

From Shila Hodgins: A few weeks ago our incredible students Julia Gudis and Sehrish Daud asked to interview me for their local podcast "Indy on Air." They asked a series of questions about teaching humanities, social justice pedagogy and what it's like being a teacher these days. In this same podcast they interviewed Jason Rantz, local conservative media personality who we are very familiar with, having been targeted this fall already, additionally with the potential of an article about Crystal. Unexpectedly, he wrote an article about the podcast.

This article follows Rantz's trend of targeting schools and teachers for talking about wearing masks or social justice, as well as the trend seen nationwide by the Department of Justice: ["Justice Department Addresses Violent Threats Against School Officials and Teachers."](#)

This is a pattern Rantz is following in an attempt to intimidate teachings into not teaching about equity and racial justice. The LWSD has adopted an equity statement and purports to be a district that leads with equity and yet when teachers and schools have been targeted for doing this work, they have remained silent and failed to protect them.

Jason Rantz is actively harmful, violent, and damaging to our community. The lack of action from the district previously has enabled Rantz to continue this pattern of disrespect and violence against Eastlake. It is the responsibility of the district to right previous wrongs and advocate for justice.</p> <p>Eastlake staff has requested statements from the district previously; the district did nothing to denounce Rantz in these previous moments despite the harm being caused. This silence has allowed Jason Rantz to continue to wreak havoc on our community and discount another Eastlake educator, Shila Hodgins. <i>I am asking that the district release a statement to stand in solidarity with Shila Hodgins and all educators advocating for equity and racial justice in their classrooms.</i></p> <p>The Lake Washington School District Equity and Family Engagement Mission states that the district is “committed to the legacy work of racial, gender and ability equity for all and the intersectionality therein, and the power this work has to disrupt the status quo.” Shila Hodgins is actively teaching with this mission in mind and deserves to be supported. If the district truly stands for anti-racist, equitable, abolitionist education, they will stand with Shila Hodgins and release a statement of support.</p> <p>Signed,</p>
