Course Description:

During this Fall Semester Music course, students will learn basic concepts of music notation including but not limited to Treble Clef Staff Notation, Quarter notes, Quarter Rests, barlines, measures, time signatures, key Signatures and dynamics. Styles of music studied will include Jazz, Blues, Classical, Pop, Rock, and Broadway. Students will both study music theory, but also use percussion instruments such as Xylophone and others. Lastly, students will study music history focused on American figures like Ray Charles, Bob Dylan, Aretha Franklin, Louis Armstrong and Elvis Presley. Students will learn the basic characteristics of the 12-bar blues form, and on instruments, play common songs, hymns and nursery rhymes that they are already familiar with.



Unit 1: Beginner's Music Notation

Major Assessment(s): Culminating in an assessment that will cover musical terms like key signature, time signature, sharps, flats, barline, Treble Clef, Middle C, Quarter Notes, Quarter Rests, Measures, Transposition, Rhythm, Melody, Harmony, and Tempo, Timbre, Pitch, Structure, Tonality.

<u>Unit 2</u>: Contemporary American Music History
Major Assessment(s): Students will be able to recognize songs by
ear and sort them by genre. These American styles include
Ragtime, Rock and Roll, Jazz, Blues, Folk, Country, Christian, Pop,
Rap and Broadway. They will be able to match each style with a
prominent musical artist in that genre.

<u>Unit 3</u>: The 12-Bar American Blues Form
Major Assessment(s): Students will be able define the basic
characteristics of America's quintessential musical form. They will
be able to outline the harmony of the blues form and its basic
musical notation I-IV-I-V-VI-I. Some students may be able to sing
or play this harmony to accompany others.

<u>Unit 4</u>: Performance of Songs using Instruments
Major Assessment(s): Using Xylophones, keyboards, Chrome
Synthesizer, or other instrument, students will be able to perform
songs not limited to but including Twinkle Twinkle Little Star, Old
MacDonald, America the Beautiful, Star Spangled Banner, Happy
Birthday, Itsy Bitsy Spider, Jingle Bells, Silent Night, etc.
