WELCOME

Welcome to the Gold Hill Middle School Band! Whether you are a new or returning band member, this program has a special place in it for you and it is our honor to play a part in your music education. This document is designed to provide you with all the information you will need about band policies, procedures and events. We ask that parents and students read through and then sign the Statement of Responsibility, acknowledging they understand the expectations of our program.

BAND STUDENT FEE

All band students will need to pay a \$40.00 band instructional fee due by *Friday, August 15*. This covers the cost of the band binder, the band shirt worn for performances, fundamentals and method books, online music software programs, sheet music and other costs for the year.

SCHOOL INSTRUMENT USE FEE

Any student who is using a school-owned instrument (*oboe, bassoon, horn, baritone, tuba*) must pay an instrument fee to Gold Hill Middle School of \$100. This fee is for the entire 2025-26 school year and is due, along by *Friday, August 15*.

Go to the GHMS website, click "Pay Fees" and login (or create an account). Click on the tab for your band student, click on band fees, add to your cart, view cart and checkout.

POLICY ON CONCERT & REHEARSAL ABSENCES

No concert or rehearsal absences will be excused without prior written notification. In the event of an emergency, written notification should be provided within 24 hours of a student's return to school. Excused absences include: Illness (with doctor's note), death in the family, unavoidable conflict with other FMSD academic activities. Failure to arrange transportation, athletic games/practices, try-outs or other events WILL NOT be excused. Unexcused absences will result in the student's grade being lowered in accordance with our grading policy and removal from band trips and performances. When a serious conflict arises, notify Mrs. Isenhour as soon as possible.

SCHOOL INSTRUMENT RENTAL INFORMATION

The Gold Hill Band Program offers the rental of very large and/or prohibitively expensive instruments not available through local music stores (Oboe, Bassoon, Bass Clarinet, Tenor and Baritone Saxophone, Horn, Baritone and Tuba). Parents and students renting the school-owned instrument are responsible for the yearly rental fee of \$100 and for all repairs beyond normal wear and tear. Students will forfeit their use of a school-owned instrument and the rental for any of the following reasons:

- Negligent treatment of the instrument by the student
- A failing grade in band for any grading period
- Failure to pay the yearly rental fee

INSTRUMENT STORAGE

Students may store instruments in the band room immediately before school begins each day. Instruments should be placed neatly in their designated area. All cases must be clearly labeled with the band student's name, address, and phone number on the outside. Instruments without labels will be placed in the band director's office until it has been claimed and labeled. Students should take their instrument home from school each day.

LOST OR STOLEN INSTRUMENTS

The band program, the school district, and the band director is not responsible for student-owned or rented instruments and materials that are lost or stolen. Each parent and student is responsible for recording the instrument's serial number at home and each student is responsible for making sure his or her instrument is always taken home at the end of the school day. If an instrument is lost or stolen:

- Notify a band director immediately and provide the serial number of the instrument.
- 2. Determine where your child last saw the instrument.
- 3. Upon teacher request, file a police report.

PRIVATE LESSONS

Private lessons are the best way to improve performance skills on a musical instrument. The one-on-one approach allows the student to benefit from the individual attention that cannot be matched in a large classroom setting. A recent survey of students in the South Carolina All-State Band revealed that 80% of those students in the band studied privately. Simply put, private lessons work! At Gold Hill, we encourage parents to consider private lessons for their child. Please consult a director for recommendations of instructors.

HONOR BAND AUDITIONS

Several audition opportunities will be offered during the year. Eighth grade students will work on the material in class in the Honors Audition Project, but seventh grade band students who are taking private lessons are encouraged to audition as well. The Honor Band opportunities are:

For the audition, students perform their scales, a solo (provided), and 1-2 sight-reading examples for a judge. They receive a score for their performance and the highest ranked students on each instrument earn placement in the honor band. The audition material is the same for all the auditions, with the exception of the solo ending for the All-State audition.

Those students selected for the honor band attend a clinic where they rehearse with a guest conductor, culminating in a performance on the music they have been working on. It is an extremely fun and rewarding experience for our band students!

PERFORMING GROUPS AT GOLD HILL

Each band class meets five days a week for 42 minutes. Performances for each group are listed on the band calendar.

The goal of this group is to provide students with strong fundamentals in music reading, posture, hand position, tone quality and also to have a lot of fun while doing it! This group performs at a Winter Informance Concert in January and again in May during their Related Arts class time for family, friends and other students.

<u>7TH GRADE BAND</u>: The 7th Grade Band consists of second year players and we work to expand on the foundational skills we established in 6th grade. Students in this group are eligible to audition for extracurricular band opportunities like honor bands, jazz band and pep band. This group performs at the Winter Concert in December, and at the Spring Awards Concert and Carowinds Music Festival in the spring.

8TH GRADE BAND: The 8th Grade Band is the premier performing group at Gold Hill. These students continue to develop their individual musical skills as well as ensemble skills. Students are highly encouraged to participate in the honor band auditions and many are selected at the county, region and state level. 8th Grade students are eligible to audition for the Gold Hill jazz band and pep band as well. Performances for this group include the Winter Concert, SCBDA Concert Performance Assessment, Performance in Orlando, FL and the Spring Awards Concert.

JAZZ BAND

The Gold Hill Jazz Band is an auditioned group of students, performing music from the jazz repertoire. It consists of traditional jazz instrumentation (sax, trumpet, trombone, bass, guitar, piano, and drum set) but non-traditional instruments are invited to audition if they'd like. This group rehearses before school on Tuesday and Thursdays from 7:20-8:00am during the months of October-December and March-May and performs at the Winter Concert and the Spring Awards Concert, with the possibility of other performances in the community.

PEP BAND

The Gold Hill Pep Band is an extracurricular group, open to any 7th or 8th Grade student. Depending on the interest, students may be asked to audition. This group rehearses during flex periods in January and performs at one boys basketball game and one girls basketball game, with the potential of performing at a school pep rally.

PERCUSSION ENSEMBLE

The Gold Hill Percussion Ensemble is open to any 7th or 8th grade percussion student, and 6th grade percussion students by director invitation. This group rehearses before school from 7:20-8:00am on Wednesdays in the band room and performs at the winter and spring concerts.
