This rebate is for community members impacted by any state declared disasters from 2018 to present for houses that were destroyed or damaged. Residents qualify for a \$10,000 - \$20,000 rebate through the Colorado Energy Office.

## **Rebate Options**

- Option #1: Electrification using air source heat pump Rebate \$10,000, or
- Option #2: Electrification using ground source heat pump -Rebate \$20,000, or
- Option #3: Rebate for only ground source heat pump of \$10,000
- Applicants may claim funds for the completion of any of the three rebate options offered. A maximum of \$20,000 per household is available.
