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Abstract

The abstract written in English should reflect the overall substance of the article and be able to help the reader to determine its relevance to their interests and decide whether to read the document in its entirety. The abstract contains statements about: Orientation / background, Research purpose / research objectives, Research design, approach and method / research design, approach, and method, Main Findings / and main findings and conclusions, Abstract written in no more than 200 words. (Times New Roman 10, single spaced in one paragraph).

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INTRODUCTION (Capital Letters, Times New Roman/TNR 12 Bold)

The introduction, among others, contains the background of the problem, the gap between what is idealised and the reality that occurs, supported by relevant current theories and research on the problem or research hypothesis then manifested in the form of a review of previous literature (state of the art) to show scientific novelty which is an innovation, At the end of the introduction, the purpose of the article study must be written. This section is written as much as a maximum of 20% of the body of the article. Sources of literature are highly recommended from primary sources (articles).

The easiest way to fulfil the writing format requirements is to use this document as a template. Then type your text into it. The paper size should match the A4 page size, which is 8.27' wide and 11.69' long. The margin limits are set as follows:

1. UP= 1.08"
2. Down= 0.98"
3. Left= Right= 1.18" (Font TNR 12, Spasi 1,15)

METHODS (Capital Letters, Times New Roman/TNR 12 Bold)

The methods section should be short, concise, clear, but sufficient. It explains the use of research methods, implementation procedures, tools, materials, or instruments

should be well explained, but not theoretical. If necessary, there is an appendix with a grid of instruments or fragments of materials used. If there are statistical formulae used as part of the method, commonly used formulae do not need to be written.

For example, any specific conditions set by the researcher in order to collect and analyse data are explained in this methods section. This section should make up a maximum of 10% (for qualitative research) or a maximum of 15% (for quantitative research) of the body of the article. (TNR 12 font, 1.15 spacing)

RESULTS OF FINDINGS (Capital letters, Times New Roman/TNR 12 Bold)


To facilitate understanding and reading, the research findings are described first, followed by the discussion section. The **Findings** section and the **Discussion** section are presented separately.

The **Findings and Discussion** section should be the largest part, at least 50% of the entire body of the article. Results can be presented in the form of tables of figures, graphs, verbal descriptions, or a combination of the three. Tables, graphs, or images should not be too long, too large, or too many, besides that tables quoted directly from the results of data analysis through applications such as SPSS etc., do not make pictures or copy the results directly into the article but are made manually and adjusted to the research objectives.

Tables and graphs presented must be referred to in the text. Tables do not contain vertical lines (upright) and horizontal lines (flat) only at the head and tail of the table. The font size of tables and figures may be reduced. The way the table is written is shown in Table 1 and the figures and graphs may be coloured or black and white with contrasting colouring, as shown in Figure 1.

DISCUSSION (Capital letters, Times New Roman/TNR 12 Bold)

The discussion is intended to interpret the research results in accordance with the theory used and not just explain the findings. The discussion should be enriched by referring to previous research results that have been published in scientific journals. Writing references in the body of the article uses a bracketed pattern (). If there is only one author: (Tuasikal, 2020); if there are two authors: example (Mori & Salam, 2020). If there are two to five authors, for the first mention all are written: for example (Idriani, Rizky, & Isal, 2020) and the next mention is written (Idriani et al., 2020). Authors of more than three people only write the first author followed by et al., for example (Janssen et al., 2010).

Referencing is preferably not a direct quote or does not contain too many direct quotes. If a statement is the essence of several references, all sources are written by mentioning all references in alphabetical order and semicolons (;) to separate between sources, for example (Adi, 2019; Idam, 2019; Jimmy, yuli, & Merri, 2020). CONCLUSION (Capital letters, Times New Roman/TNR 12 Bold)

Conclusions are not just repeating the data, but are the substance of meaning. It can be a statement about what is expected, as stated in the 'introduction' chapter which can eventually produce the 'results and discussion' chapter so that there is compatibility. In addition, prospects for the development of research results and prospects for future research applications can also be added (based on the results and discussion). The conclusion section answers the hypothesis, research objectives and research findings as well as suggestions related to further ideas from the research. The conclusion is presented in paragraph form.

All references referred to in the entire text of the article must be listed in the **Bibliography** section with a minimum number of 12 references. Writing the bibliography and citation application with APA style. (Font TNR 12, Spacing 1.15)

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
