Purpose and Make-up of the Design Team

The Process Design Team was formed by the Church Board in March, 2018 with the following stated purpose:

"We charge the Process Design Team to develop and implement a process to guide congregational discernment about LGBTQ topics, involving all voices, within the Mennonite Church of Normal. This Team will provide regular reports, present plans in advance of implementation, and provide a final report with recommendations to the Board."

Guiding Congregational Motto

To guide our congregation in this process, we are using the framework already chosen by our congregation as guideposts for our church life:

"Offering Christ's peace to hearts, home, community, and world."

- In offering peace to *hearts & homes* through this process, we want to proceed with the guidance of "graceful engagement." This means we approach each other with the acknowledgment that we all strive to be faithful followers of Christ. We agree that a successful process should result in opportunity for everyone to feel heard.
- In offering peace to community & world through this process we consider that we are a
 welcoming church. We may have different understandings of what welcoming means,
 but we are called to hospitality, to invite everyone to the table, to be committed to
 intentional conversation and spaces.
- Peace does not mean an absence of conflict, but a choice about how we respond to one another when we are in conflict.

Helpful Terminology

In the survey and throughout our process the following terms and definitions are being used:

- Gender identity: describes how you see yourself
- **Gender expression:** describes the way in which a person expresses their gender identity, typically through appearance, dress, and behavior
- **Gender attribution**: describes how gender is perceived by others
- Sexual orientation: an enduring emotional, romantic or sexual attraction to other people.
- LGBTQ functions as an umbrella term for various sexual identities and expressions.
 - Lesbian: A woman who is emotionally, romantically or sexually attracted to other women.
 - Gay: A person who is emotionally, romantically or sexually attracted to members of the same gender. This concept is often, though not exclusively, used to reference male homosexuals.
 - Bisexual: A person emotionally, romantically or sexually attracted to more than one gender expression though not necessarily at the same time, in the same way, or to the same degree.
 - Transgender: An umbrella term for people whose gender expression is different from cultural expectations based on the sex determined at birth. Being transgender does not imply any specific sexual orientation. Therefore, transgender people may identify as straight, gay, lesbian, bisexual, etc.
 - Queer: A term people often use to express fluid identities and orientations. Often used interchangeably with "LGBTQ."
 - Questioning: A term used to describe people who are in the process of exploring their sexual orientation or gender identity.
- **Cisgender**: A term used to describe a person whose gender identity aligns with those typically associated with the sex determined at birth.
