I beseech thee to respond to this summons by addressing the following in a written statement (10): Thy name, thy employment, thy family/social circumstances, a list of materials which art deemed necessary for thy travels, and a notice of the theme of thy tale.

In addition to the wondrous prizes at stake for the champion tale, the passage of English will require participation in this event. 40 points towards quarter second shall serve as motivation to propel thee towards most excellent cooperation and

creativity.
