Beginning April 5, 2021, all Florida residents 16 years of age and older may receive a COVID-19 vaccination

Federal Vaccine Sites

Federally-supported vaccination sites in Tampa, Orlando, Jacksonville, and Miami are offering COVID-19 vaccinations and do NOT require appointments. Walk-ups are encouraged. Four main sites are open 7am – 7pm, 7 days a week and can administer 3,000 vaccines per day. More information: [Federally Supported Sites](#). Health Departments / UF Health Clinics

Florida residents can register at clinics operated by the Alachua County Health Department in collaboration with UF. Minors (ages 16 and 17) will need parent/guardian permission to be vaccinated.
