The Human Rights Council,

Reminding all Nations of the World of United Nations Resolution 1325 (1999) which addresses how women and young girls are affected by gender-based violence,

Emphasizing the importance of the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW),

Deeply concerned about the persistent lack of adequate protection for women against gender-based violence,

Urges, all United Nation entities to ensure that both women and men get equal rights and opportunities,

- 1. <u>Urges</u> all member nations to enhance laws and enforcement mechanisms against gender-based violence by:
 - a. Increasing funding for domestic violence shelters, victim support services, and legal aid programs,
 - b. Enhancing police training to improve handling of gender-based crimes and survivor protection,
 - c. Promoting awareness campaigns to reduce stigma and encourage reporting of gender-based violence,
- 2. <u>Demands</u> that further action should be taken to protect the rights of all women around the world by,
 - a. Declaring that all countries in Central Asia and around the world enforces more laws to ensure that women get equal rights as men,
- 3. <u>Calling</u> all nations to sign treaties to protect women's rights, and ensuring that these treaties are the rights of women all around the world are protected, and demands all nations to follow these treaties accordingly.
