## **CDBG-Arlington Income Qualifications**

<u>NOTE</u>: Proof of Income is for City of Arlington residents that do NOT meet one of the Categorical Eligibility Requirements listed above (i.e. Homeless Persons, Abused Children, Age 62 and older, Battered Spouses, Severely disabled person, HIV-Positive Individuals, active recipient of TANF, SNAP, Medicare, Medicaid (not CHIP), or SSI, etc.).

Also, these labels of Categorical Eligibility are per HUD qualifications and are not the terms typically utilized by EmpathyHQ.

For individuals qualifying as Low to Moderate Household Income, you must provide proof of income for all household members under the following limits based on household size:
