

## Administrator Briefs!



## Welcome to Administrator Brief #2.

The WIABE Action Coalition, a component of the WIABE organization, has created a module dedicated to administrators of programs for language learners. The module provides information about a range of essential topics related to the administration of ESL and bilingual programs in Wisconsin, including state regulations, program design and implementation, family engagement, standards/assessment/ accountability for bilingual-bicultural education, teacher recruitment/support/retention, and Wisconsin bi/multilingual learner assurances. Each month one of these components will be selected as the focus for the Administrator Briefs. The discussion will continue with an **Administrator Institute** at the annual WIABE Conference.

This brief summarizes planning, design, and implementation of bilingual-bicultural programs, which are discussed fully in the module.

- The section on strategic planning reviews the process in selecting a bilingual-bicultural
  program design while taking into consideration input from all stakeholders to achieve
  community goals. Bi/multilingual-multicultural asset-based education research and
  implementation guidelines are reviewed while obtaining input from the community.
- 2. The *Bilingual-bicultural program models* include the 8 options available for bilingual-bicultural programs in the State of Wisconsin. More information on each program can be found in the dpi *Program Model CrossWalk*.
- 3. The program design section highlights the process that schools/districts might follow after a bilingual-bicultural model of instruction has been selected, including roles of teachers, parents, and students; curriculum development and language allocation; and development of an efficient and equitable assessment plan.
- 4. Program implementation focuses on the collaborative plan for establishing a quality bilingual-bicultural program within a school or district.
