#### **Guest Speaker**

- Guest Speaker: Dr. Tim Crowley, Interim Provost
- Third week enrollment Increased since first day and is up 1.6 percent (196 students)
  - Freshmen are down 2.7% (29 students)
  - Transfer (15% 97 new Transfers)
    - Other schools are down in Transfers
    - Testament to work done to increase transfer enrollment
  - o Graduate enrollments are down 314 students
  - Dual enrollment is up 46.6% (449 students up)
  - Retention is up 73% FTFT
  - Overall is retention is 72%

Rutt asked what transfer type the institution is getting. Dr. Crowley stated that most are two year to four year but some are four year to four year transfers. Our primary partners are MCC and State Fair. Our strong feeder programs are Elementary Education, Criminal Justice, Secondary Education, but they are still compiling data points for the highest transfer in programs.

- Mobile Pay Parking Users will pay by phone using a QR code and can extend their time online as needed. These spots will replace some of the visitor parking spaces and will be open for use by anyone, including faculty/staff, students, and visitors, on a first come first serve basis. More details will be given at the next TPPC meeting.
- **Parking Lot Maintenance** This was not able to be done this year as planned. Steps will be taken to assess the state of the lots and determine need priorities on a year-to-year basis.
- License Place Recognition LPR is fully active now. It scans vehicle plates and can identify which parking lot a vehicle is in as well as that vehicle's permit. Please update your vehicles and license plates to be sure they are current. Users can add a rental vehicle to their permit using the online system or by calling Parking Services. To remove a vehicle from a permit, users must call Parking Services as this option is not available online. Citations will now be virtual, no more tickets on vehicles. Vehicle owners will be notified by email if they have a UCM email. Users may have multiple vehicles listed on a permit, but only ONE can be parked on campus at a time. If more than one vehicle on the same permit is found to be parked on campus at the same time, it will result in a ticket. This system will not work if the plate is not visible, such as when covered by snow.
