

Peace be upon you all brothers and sisters. I feel excited and delighted to introduce to you the Christ Michael Center Farm project (CMC). The Christ Michael Center is a spiritual organization based in USA Maryland Baltimore and established in 7 different countries. CMC has cell groups in Nigeria, USA, Ghana, Uganda, Jamaica, South Africa and Dubai. We are officially and legally registered in Uganda as the Christ Micheal Outreach Foundation Uganda operating with the required legal documentation to carry out our mission and community activities.

The CMC Farm Project is a vision we started with the hope of creating a sustainable place that can support service, community development, practical ways of helping others and supporting the broad mission and vision of the Christ Michael Center. The farm is located in Ibanda District, Ishongororo Town Council, Kakiindo Cell, Western Uganda seated on 3 acres of land. Through the support of friends, we were able to acquire three acres of land, which became the foundation of this dream. We officially began this project in March 2024, and since then we have continued working step by step to develop the land. The first stages involved purchasing the land, measuring the boundaries, clearing the area, and completing the fencing. This was not always easy because transporting materials to the farm has been one of our biggest challenges. The road access to the property is still difficult, especially during rainy seasons, making it hard for vehicles to reach the site. Because of this, many materials have had to be transported manually, sometimes using wheelbarrows, which slows down the work and increases the effort required. Despite these challenges, we have continued moving forward. The farm has already started producing. We were able to plant, grow, and harvest maize and beans as part of our farming practice. Although the harvest was not large, it was a very important achievement for us because it showed that the land is productive and gave us practical experience. The small income from this harvest was also used to support the farm project itself. Seeing crops planted, growing, and harvested has been a great encouragement because it shows that the farm is moving from preparation into actual production.

Still through the support of friends with generous hearts, we have also been working on developing the necessary facilities on the property that is the Farm House and Sanitary Facility to support daily activities. We began constructing a farm house, which is now about 80% complete. The structure has taken shape and is already usable in some form, but it is still not fully finished. The main challenge has been limited resources and the difficulty of transporting construction materials to the site because of poor road access. Vehicles cannot easily reach the farm, so materials often have to be carried manually, which slows down the progress. Another major challenge has been the heavy rains, which have affected the unfinished parts of the building. The outer walls are still exposed, and the rain has been slowly weakening some of the bare bricks. This has made it urgent for us to complete the plastering and finishing so that the structure can be fully protected and preserved. Alongside the farm house, we also started working on a sanitary facility for the farm. This has also faced delays due to the same challenges of road access, transport of materials, and limited funding. At one point, the structure began to deteriorate slightly because it was not yet fully completed and was exposed to the weather. Recently, we were able to bring more materials to the site and continue construction.

The sanitary facility is now taking shape again, and we are hopeful that it will soon be completed and ready for safe use.

Another great milestone that brought us joy was bringing light to the farmhouse. For a long time, the farmhouse remained dark at night, but recently we were able to install solar lighting. The solar panels that were installed on the farm house produce a total of 50W. Our vision is to continue developing this into a mixed farm combining crops, poultry and livestock that can become a sustainable foundation for service. Once fully developed, the farm will help support food production, create opportunities, strengthen community activities, and provide a practical example of service.

As we continue developing the farm, our long-term vision is to establish a fully functioning mixed farm that combines different areas of agriculture and becomes a sustainable foundation for service in Uganda and beyond. We hope to expand the farm by introducing poultry keeping, goat keeping, and cattle farming, creating a balanced agricultural system where different activities support one another. We also plan to increase coffee production on the farm and continue growing other crops that are suitable for the area as part of normal mixed farming practices. Our goal is not only to produce food, but also to create a place that demonstrates practical service, self-reliance, and cooperation. A developed farm will provide opportunities for learning, farming experience, and community involvement while creating resources that can support the wider mission of CMC.

Beyond agriculture, we see this farm as a foundation for the revelation in Uganda and Africa as a place where people can gather, learn, share ideas, and experience the values of love, service, and brotherhood in practical ways. As the farm grows, we hope it can support activities such as outreach programs, educational gatherings, distribution of The Urantia Book, conferences, and other initiatives that help spread the message of spiritual growth and service. We understand that this vision will take time, dedication, and continued support, but we believe that every tree planted, every animal raised, every structure completed, and every step forward is building toward something greater. Our dream is to see this small beginning develop into a lasting center of agriculture, service, and spiritual fellowship that can positively impact many lives in Uganda and across Africa.

We are inviting friends and well-wishers to join us in this journey. Your generous support will help us complete the remaining structures, protect the buildings from weather damage, improve access to the farm, expand farming activities, and continue building a project that can serve many people in the future. This project started as a small seed, but with every step forward, we see the potential of what it can become.
